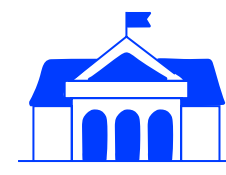
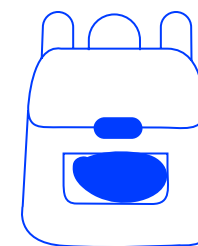
Abu Dhabi's education ecosystem currently boasts **205 private schools** providing **14 different curricula** (*American, Bangladeshi, British, Canadian, French, German, Indian, International Baccalaureate (IB), Japanese, Pakistani, Philippine Curriculum, SABIS®, Spanish, UAE Ministry of Education*) to approximately **243,000 students**, in addition to public and Charter schools.

In addition to private and public schools, Abu Dhabi's [Charter Schools](#) are the outcome of a unique partnership between the government and the private sector. This strategic partnership stimulates an exceptional exchange of global experiences and supports the national agenda to create a sustainable, knowledge-based and competitive economy.

Abu Dhabi's private and Charter schools focus on ensuring children in Abu Dhabi - irrespective of their socio-economic background and the type of school they attend - are equipped with key skills such as digital literacy, critical thinking, and collaborative and communicative capabilities.



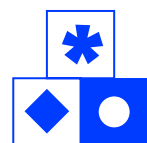

We are the local or Emirate-level regulator of the education sector in Abu Dhabi. We oversee and provide services throughout a learner's journey from early education to university and beyond. However, we go beyond regulating to empowering education by partnering with our stakeholders to enable a great education system to flourish. With a mandate to foster the best education ecosystem that enables every Abu Dhabi learner to actively contribute and compete on a global stage, we also seek to empower minds by recognizing that every learner is different and a diversity of teaching methods are essential for students to succeed. And we do the above to ensure we empower the future of Abu Dhabi with future-ready graduates who have the 21st century skills required to sustain and carry-forward our Emirate's vision.

EARLY EDUCATION

Licensing and regulating over 250 nurseries and promoting the importance of early education for children's brain development in line with the Early Childhood Authority's directives.

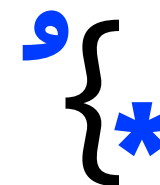
THE SCHOOL YEARS (K-12)

Licensing and regulating over 200 private schools operating in the Emirate of Abu Dhabi with a diversity of 14 curricula.

- Private schools who follow the Ministry of Education curriculum report to the Ministry of Education while ADEK implements directives and supports these schools where required.



- ADEK also owns, legislates and manages its own schools:
 - Charter Schools: Publicly funded and privately operated by the top school operators in the Emirate, these schools aim to put **Students First** and deliver a quality education for every child.
 - Al Karamah School and the Mohamad Bin Rashid Center for students with autism: These two specialized schools provide much needed support for children on the autism spectrum. ADEK also launched Al Karamah Vocational Institute to enable 12th graders to gain the necessary skills required to join the workforce.



UNIVERSITY PREPARATION & CAREER GUIDANCE



Through Rize University Preparation and Career Guidance program (Rize UPG), ADEK readies students for university by preparing them for mandatory examinations and helping them with university applications. It also provides career guidance through aptitude testing and internship opportunities.

HIGHER EDUCATION IN ABU DHABI

While the licensing of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) is the mandate of the Ministry of Education, ADEK helps shape the HEI landscape in the Emirate. We audit and enhance the delivery of higher education in Abu Dhabi, attract the required HEIs to open the required programs or schools to serve Abu Dhabi's needs, and champion the creation of a student and faculty friendly ecosystem. Special projects under this sector include the launch of 42 Abu Dhabi coding school, which boasts a revolutionary disruptive learning methodology set to graduate tech savvy talent to serve all industries.



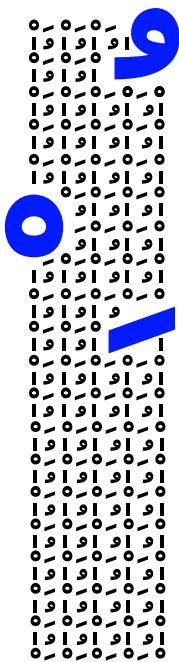
ABU DHABI SCHOLARSHIPS FOR DISTINGUISHED STUDENTS



ADEK annually provides up to 80 distinguished Emirati students with full scholarships and support to study at the best universities around the world. Abu Dhabi Scholarship students are taken care of throughout their journey: Before they leave home, during their higher education journey abroad and upon their return.



ADEK STAKEHOLDERS & PARTNERSHIPS



Our stakeholders include school owners, investors and operators, other local and federal government entities, parents and students, teachers, principals, faculty and staff at educational institutions, academic researchers and higher education institutions.

We take the lead in bridging the gap between industry and academia by partnering with prime multi-sector public and private sector organizations that can help open up a huge range of personal and career development opportunities for students. This partnership program is aligned to Abu Dhabi's developmental goals, which herald the start of a new co-operation paradigm between leadership and citizens.

Our strategic partners offer comprehensive opportunities for students, including skills and knowledge competitions, workshops, career guidance, internships and scholarships, training, summer school challenges and curriculum development, as well as future job openings and placements. These exciting partnerships help develop competencies and foster learning as a way of life, helping students acquire the skills and experiences necessary to seize new opportunities and lead fulfilling lives according to their talents, capabilities and ambitions.

CHARTER SCHOOLS

Founded in 2018, this performance-based partnership between the public and the private sector offers a third education model in Abu Dhabi and has now grown to include 22 schools.

Charter Schools are unique within the region and offer an American-based curriculum to kindergarten and cycle one, with more grades set to be introduced as the student body progresses their educational journeys.

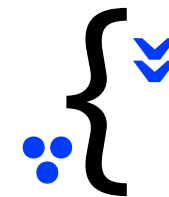
Our Charter Schools across the Emirate prioritize the needs of close to 20,000 students and deliver a quality education tailored to each student's capabilities.



STUDENTS OF DETERMINATION

The UAE refers to people with special needs or disabilities as "People of Determination" in recognition of their achievements in different fields. In 2020, a comprehensive strategy for 'People of Determination' was launched in Abu Dhabi. His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces, said the strategy "re-affirms our commitment to inclusion, equality and empowerment for all members of UAE society."

Along with providing a tailored approach, we champion the inclusion of Students of Determination into mainstream schools, in addition to providing specialized schools.



We have developed a highly proactive inclusion strategy through which students of determination can access quality education ensure their full integration into the educational system. Our role is to constantly explore ways to tailor our support, deliver inclusive education, and foster deeper partnerships with communities and businesses in order to develop their skillsets, celebrate their achievements and facilitate their progression from education to employment.

Consequently, we implemented the ADEK Autism Inclusion Project, which sees students of determination enrol in and receive special academic services at mainstream schools, helping them learn among their age-group peers as well as enabling their educational journey to shift from supported inclusion to independence in mainstream education.

In addition, we have established and currently oversee specialized education facilities for students of determination: [The Mohammed bin Rashid Center for Special Education – NECC](#), [Al Karamah School](#), and Al Karamah Training Institute.

The Mohammed bin Rashid Center for Special Education opened in 2007 and is operated by NECC. It provides UAE national children with autism and related disorders with intensive educational services utilizing the proven principles of Applied Behavior Analysis.

Al Karamah School opened its doors in 2019 and is operated by the UK's Priory Group. It is the first school in the region dedicated to children with autism and associated learning difficulties and offers cutting-edge facilities, a differentiated curriculum and highly-skilled staff for students with autism to ensure the best educational environment for lifelong success.

Al Karamah Training Institute opened in 2021 and is designed to empower students of determination on the autism spectrum with career-oriented skills and future pathways for independent living and employment. A tailored education center provides access to post-graduation vocational and professional training in eight main areas of specialization. Students can gain recognized qualifications from UK awarding bodies including the Award Scheme Development and Accreditation Network and the National Open College Network.

ABU DHABI SCHOLARSHIPS

We provide several scholarship programs for distinguished Emiratis, to facilitate high-quality education for the national workforce and support the development efforts in the UAE. The aim is to support them to specialize in majors of priority that meet the Emirate's labor market needs, in top ranked universities nationally and internationally. Students, accepted in any of ADEK's scholarship programs, will receive a holistic support system, to help them achieve the highest results.

INTERNATIONAL & STANDARDIZED BENCHMARK ASSESSMENTS

Our schools participate in a range of objective standardized tests and assessments, which measure student learning and are essential in gathering invaluable data for continuous improvement.

International assessment tests we participate in include PISA, TIMMS and PIRLS.

Standardized benchmark assessments are mandated by ADEK and are based on the school's curriculum. Those include the NWEA MAP, GL Progress, EI ASSET, ACER IBT and ACER ISA test series.

Through these tests, assessments and collected data, we can identify what is working and what is not. The generated data help us identify and close gaps, raise standards and attain goals. These tests and assessments are also useful in holding education stakeholders to account for success or failure.



CAREER GUIDANCE & ENRICHMENTS PROGRAMS

The Rize Program supports students from early stages to graduation and is split into three different pathways. The first comprises intervention programs to support students most in need and to help them upskill. The second includes enrichment programs for skill development, while the third helps with university preparation and career guidance, so students can explore their options as they transition from school to university.

Our Rize after-school enrichment program provides students with project-based learning opportunities to develop, apply and transfer future skills. It follows three main themes – Rize Tech, Rize Arts and Culture, as well as Rize Math. By focusing on STEAM subjects including Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics, we prepare students for whatever the future may hold. The initiative exposes students to new 21st century-relevant subjects such as AI and strengthens their core capabilities in foundation subjects such as math, and culturally significant subjects like the Arabic language.

Through the Rize University Preparation and Career Guidance Program (Rize UPCG), we prepare public school students in grades 9-12 for the next step in their academic and pre-professional journeys. The program provides students with core academic and standardized test preparation in mathematics and English and helps them explore various career and post-secondary pathways. It also helps their preparation to attend leading domestic and international higher education institutions and identifies best-in-class local talent for our international scholarship opportunities. Registered students, who we call Rizers, can take advantage of courses to improve core academic skills, improve their standardized testing skills, receive university application guidance and attend webinars and workshops led by elite international universities and speakers from leading international private and public organizations.

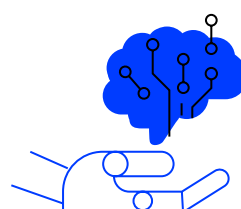
In addition to public holidays, there are lots of other events that take place throughout the school year. We have summarized the most important ones for you below, be sure to check the links for the latest updates!

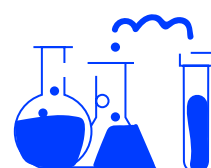

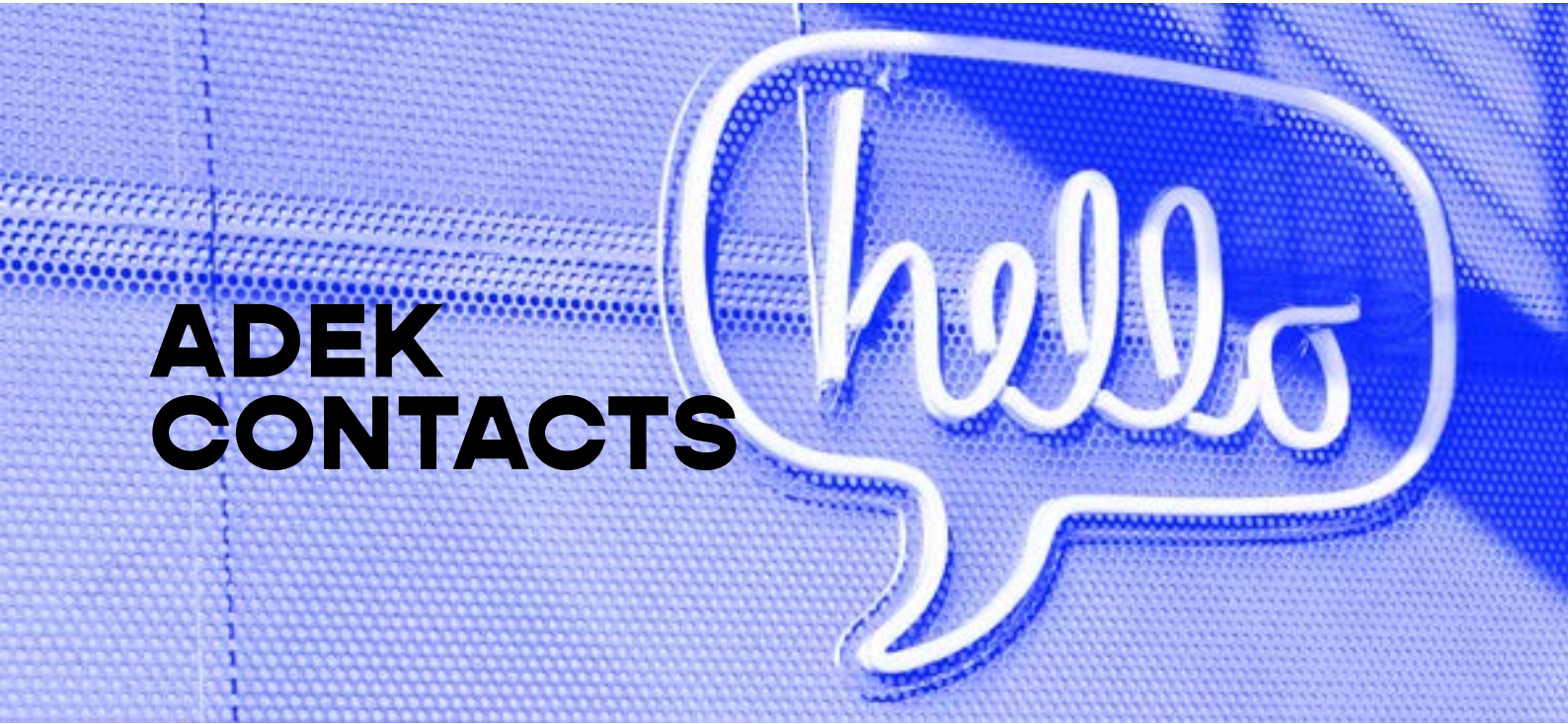

UAE NATIONAL DAY & PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

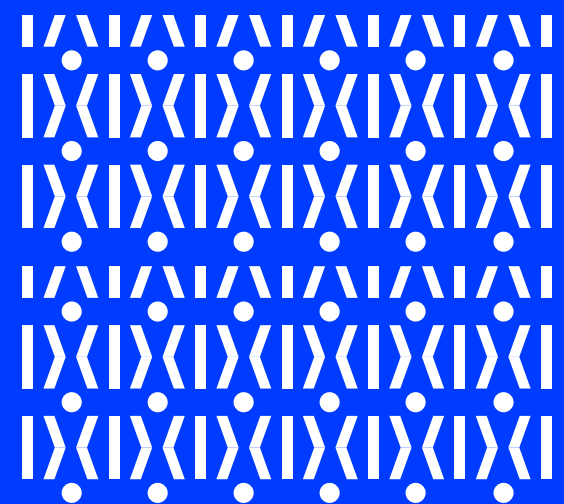

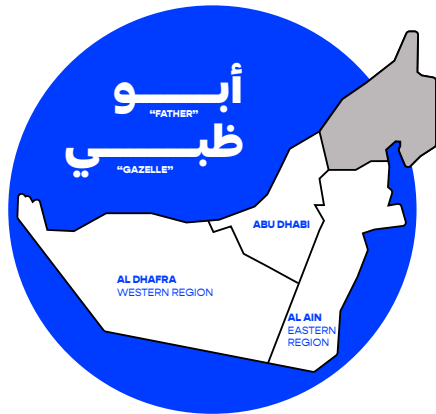
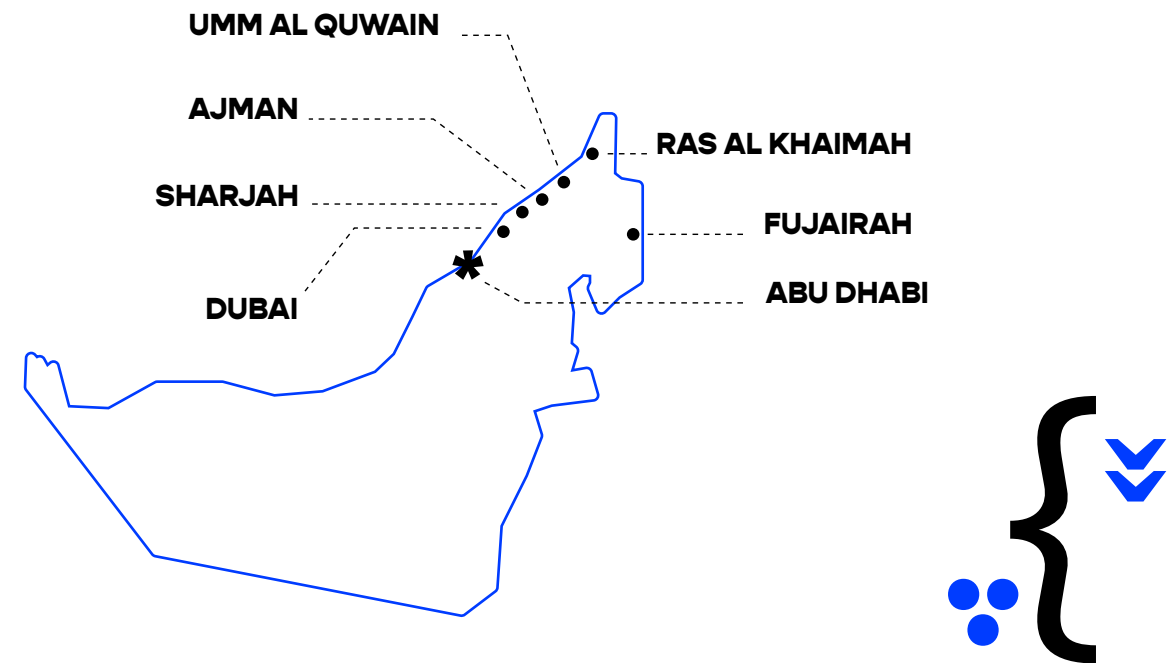
EMIRATI CULTURE

The United Arab Emirates is made up of seven emirates including Abu Dhabi, which is the largest and also the capital city. Recognized as a tolerant country, the UAE hosts more than 200 nationalities who enjoy doing business, living, learning and exploring the country. Abu Dhabi is home to over 80% of the UAE's landmass and has the second largest population amongst the seven emirates. The official national language of Abu Dhabi is Arabic, although, English, Hindi and Urdu are also widely spoken in and around the city.

Boasting beautiful desert and marine landscapes, this emirate is made up of three main regions – Abu Dhabi, Al Ain (Eastern Region) and Al Dhafra (Western Region). Thanks to its geographically diverse scenery and rich culture and history, the Emirate is a dream to explore.

It is difficult to trace the origins of Abu Dhabi's name because the history was traditionally passed down by word of mouth through folklore and poetry. We know that "Abu" is Arabic for father, and "Dhabi" is the Arabic word for gazelle. It is thought that this name came about because of the abundance of gazelles in the area.

Over recent years, Abu Dhabi has been transformed into a modern, cosmopolitan, high-rise capital. The gorgeous archipelago offers a mix of ancient history, rich culture and heritage, stunning nature, beautiful beaches, high-end luxury, surprising wildlife, family-friendly adventure, world-class shopping, renowned golf courses and a welcoming atmosphere.

CUSTOMS & TRADITIONS



Emirati people descend from the Bani Yas tribe, the most significant tribe of the UAE, and still maintain many of the customs and traditions of those times. The Bani Yas tribe is made up of approximately 20 subsections, originally centered in the Liwa oasis. Traditionally the members spent the winter with their camels in the desert, and many of them went pearling during the summer. The Bani Yas is one of the most highly regarded tribes of Southern Arabia.

HOSPITALITY

Emirati hospitality is centered around providing a warm and personal welcome. This is a principle deeply entrenched in Emirati culture, reflecting their historical reputation for generosity, courtesy and love of community. Emirati households, for instance, ensure the majlis (reception area) is prepared for guests at all times. It is also perfumed with Oud and Dukhoon (incense) to welcome guests, who are invited to sit in places of honor within the room.

These relatively small gestures speak volumes about the hospitality of the hosts and the genuine warmth towards visitors. They embrace you no matter your age, religion or ethnicity and welcome you into their tribe, adhering to a vision of a united and inclusive community.

The Arabic coffee pot (dallah) is strongly present in home decor, on fabric, in gardens and sculptures. You can even find it at the center of the 1 Dirham coin.

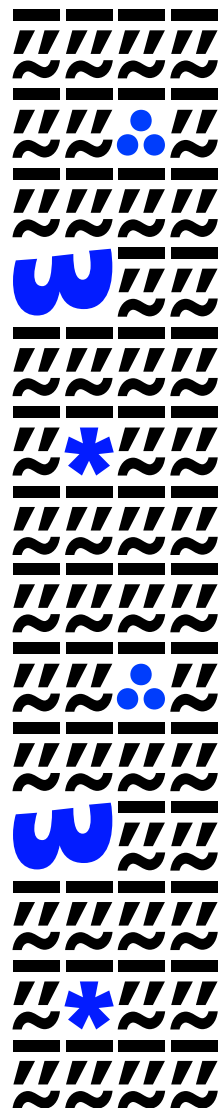
BUT FIRST COFFEE...

If you are invited into an Emirati's home, you will more than likely be offered refreshments which could include multiple helpings of luqaimat (a traditional Emirati dessert) - you just can't say no to - and cups of Arabic coffee, an important part of Emirati hospitality and considered a ceremonial act of generosity.

It is tradition for the person serving the coffee in a majlis, to hold the dallah in their left hand. If there is an important person in the majlis, they should be served first. The server (muqahwi) should then serve others, starting with the person on their right. After drinking, it is customary to gently shake the small cup to show the muqahwi you have finished and ensure no offence is given.

EMIRATI TRADITIONAL DRESS

The Emirati traditional dress is an important part of its history and culture and is worn in public with pride. It suits the weather and offers protection from the sun and heat.

Women wear a long, loose, black robe called an Abaya over the top of their normal clothes. Abayas are flowing garments with intricate embroidery and beadwork at the wrists and hem. Traditional Abayas are plain and black. However, modern-styled Abayas are given a contemporary touch through embroideries and artwork on dark fabric. There are now several more colors such as grey, brown and beige which give a modern twist to the traditional dress.

The Shayla (headscarf) covers the head and is becoming more elaborate and somewhat a statement of individuality, particularly among the young.

Emirati men wear the Kandura – a white full-length shirt-like robe, which is sometimes called a Thawb, Thobe or Dishdasha. The matching embroidery on the collar and the sleeves is a major feature differentiating Emirati Kandura from other Kanduras worn in the Arabian Gulf.

Kanduras are designed following the season in terms of fabric and color. Summer Kanduras are mainly white and made from a noticeably lighter fabric. In contrast, during the winter, there is an increase in darker colored robes, especially brown and grey, made from thicker fabric materials. Men wear a white or red and white rectangular cotton headdress, known as a Ghutra. The Agal (black cord) secures the Ghutra onto the head.

On more important occasions, Sheikhs and businessmen will wear a more formal garment. The Bisht is a thin gold-trimmed flowing robe that is worn over the Kandura.

Perfumes are also an essential part of the traditional dress of UAE for both men and women. Oud (agarwood) and rose are the most famous and expensive scents that Emiratis use. Traditionally, they also burn Bakhoor (wood chips soaked in fragrant oils) to enhance the fragrance to their garments before leaving the house.

UAE women are very fond of earrings, bracelets and rings which are an integral part of the national dress. Modesty is important, however Emirati ladies enjoy wearing makeup such as kohl to highlight features. The henna beauty ritual of painting the hands and feet with henna dye is also a part of their rich culture.

Women wear henna any time but especially at weddings and special occasions. It is widely available in traditional salons around UAE and provides a great opportunity to connect with the local culture.

As a foreigner, although your dress code is at your discretion, it is advisable to be respectful of the culture, wear longer lengths and cover sensitive parts of the body.

EMIRATI TRADITIONAL POETRY, SONG AND DANCE

POETRY

Poetry is considered a key art form and the style of ancient poetry in the UAE was strongly influenced by the 8th century Arab scholar, Al Khalil bin Ahmed.

Abu Dhabi-based Million's Poet is a special TV talent show that has revolutionized a traditional art form for the modern era, revitalizing Nabati poetry for a young Arab generation and reconnecting them with a heritage that stretches back five centuries. The program attracts audiences not just in the UAE but all over the world.

DANCE

Dance is very important to the people of the UAE and there are seven main types which are performed at special occasions such as weddings, festivals and parties. Some dances are performed in large groups of up to 200 such as **Al Ayyalah** and other dances like the **Haban** are smaller in size. Dance dates back to the old days when people lived in the heart of the desert and is seen as an act of celebration.

The most famous and traditional Emirati dance is called **Al Ayyalah** or "stick dance" which is the national dance of the UAE. It is performed by local men and plays a prominent part in major celebrations and events, including national ceremonies and weddings.

This performance is accompanied by traditional Arabic music and drums, and is a privilege to observe. Dancers face each other in two rows signifying the unity and co-operation amongst tribal people. They sing and chant while twirling thin sticks up, over and around.

Sometimes women can be seen performing the **Raqs sha'ar** dance. The ladies move slowly in unison, swaying their hair while keeping their hips still. Their dresses, brightly colored and intricately embroidered, are the most important aspect of the dance.



EMIRATI CUISINE

A reflection of the UAE's trading heritage, Emirati food is infused with spices and ingredients from throughout Asia and the Middle East. Think cinnamon, saffron, cardamom, turmeric, nuts, limes and dried fruit. Emirati cuisine is a blend of Middle Eastern and Asian influences, but the modern-day diet has become more cosmopolitan given the influx of expats from around the world.

Emirati dishes are flavorful and aromatic. Some of the most popular dishes include Harees, a showcase of meat and wheat slow-cooked in a clay oven or pot and served with ghee (clarified butter) and Machboos, a mix of rice, meat, onions, various spices, and dried lime (or loomi). Being a coastal city, fish is the star of many local dishes, with Madrooba, a mix of salted fish, spices and thick sauce, being one of the most popular. Rice is ever-present and most often served with saffron, nuts and spices.

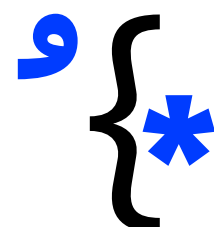

SOCIAL ETIQUETTE

Given that the UAE is an Islamic country, certain protocols exist to ensure respect for the people, customs and traditions. Here are a couple pointers to keep in mind:

- ✓ It is polite to ask permission before taking photos of people in the UAE, particularly women. In public areas designated for women and children only, there may even be a camera ban in place.
- ✓ Avoid taking photographs of government buildings, military installations, ports and airports, which could get you into serious trouble.
- ✓ Avoid public displays of affection with your partner or spouse, it is uncommon to do so in the UAE.
- ✓ Dress sensibly and appropriately for the context you are in. A bathing suit belongs on the beach, not the mall.
- ✓ Use a taxi service when spending an evening out on the town (if you plan to drink alcohol) and be mindful of excessive consumption and behavior.
- ✓ Always remember that respect is a core value of the UAE. Swearing is considered highly offensive and is punishable by law.

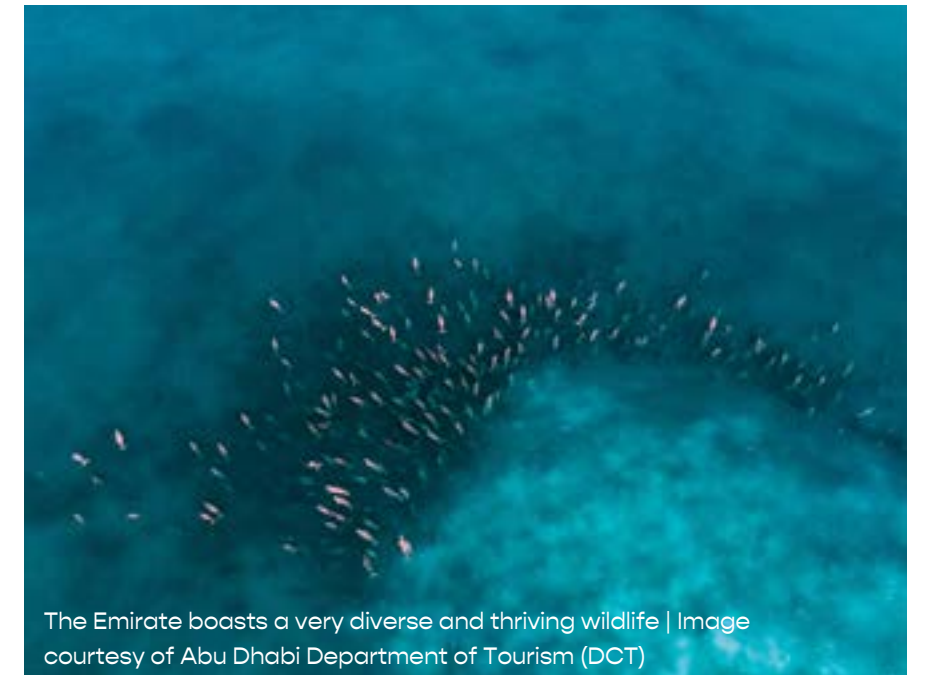

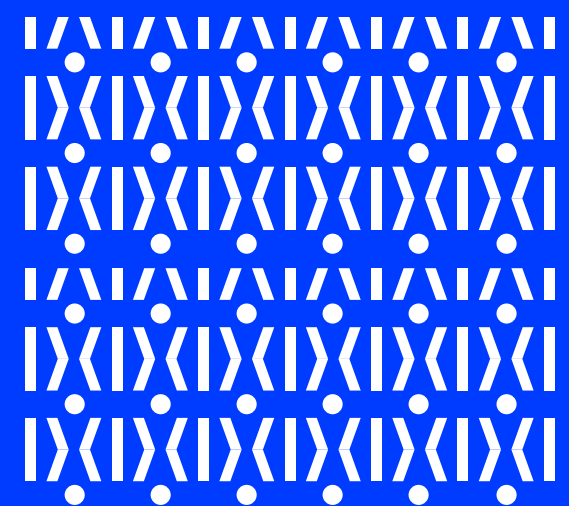
Abu Dhabi is home to diverse terrains and natural wonders – mesmerizing deserts, fertile oases, archipelago islands, stunning beaches, mysterious mangrove forests and impressive wildlife reserves. These can be enjoyed through experiences catering to all activity levels, from walking and mountain biking to scuba diving, free diving, kayaking, 4x4 safaris, horse rides, fossil finding and much more.

Abu Dhabi's natural resources have always been key to its prosperity, so they're vigilantly protected. In keeping with the vision of the late UAE founder, Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, Abu Dhabi is deeply committed to preserving the Emirate's environment and ecology. The Sheikh Zayed Protected Areas Network, for example, is made up of 19 protected areas. Some of these – such as Bu Tinah island within the Marawah Marine Biosphere Reserve, the region's largest UNESCO-designated marine biosphere reserve – is only open to researchers. 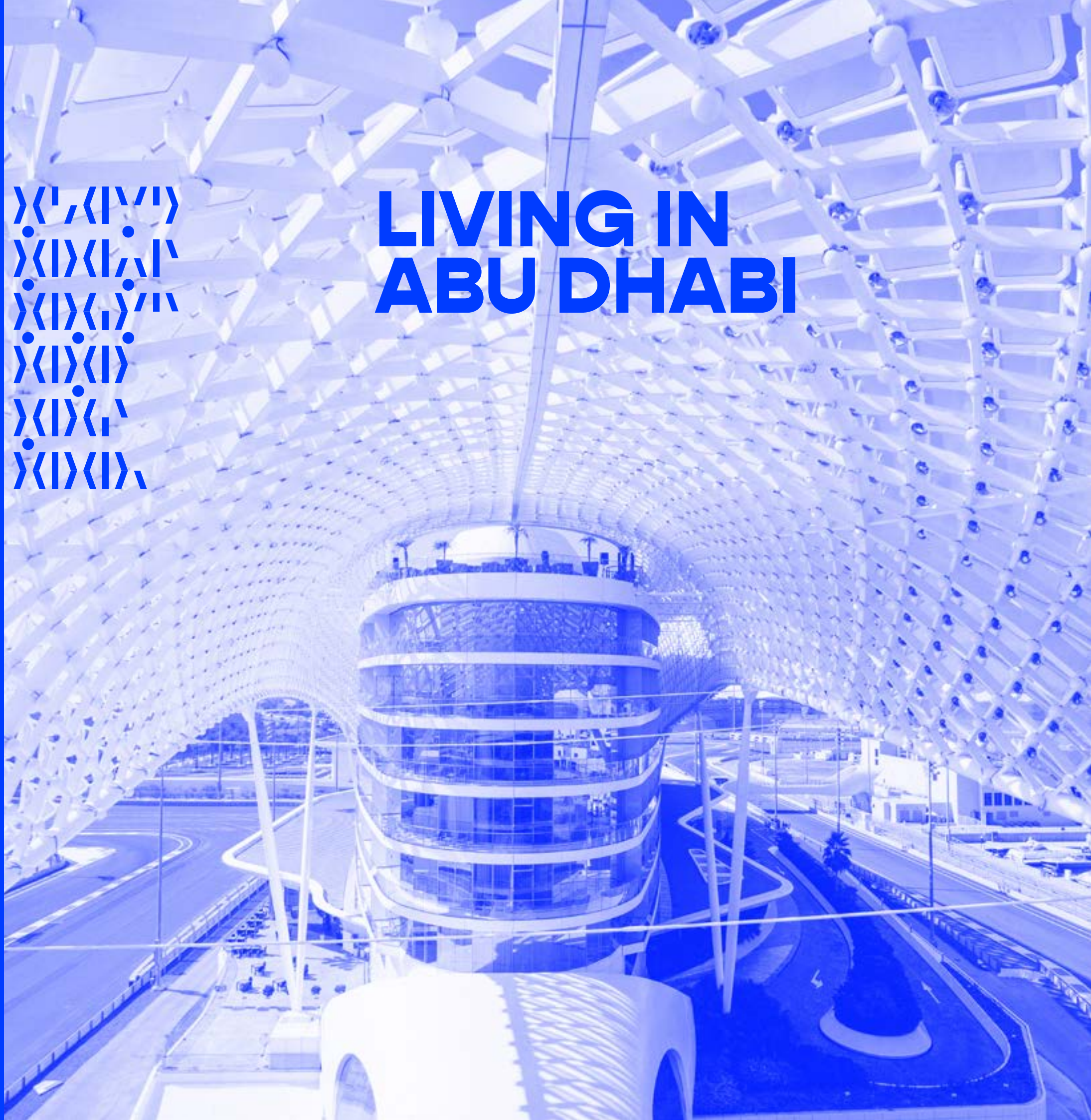

With the COVID-19 situation remaining fluid, the UAE and Abu Dhabi are constantly adjusting related requirements and protocols to ensure everybody is kept safe while economic activity resumes. To stay abreast of these updates, we recommend you follow these channels:

Being a new resident, you have a grace period of 60 days to be vaccinated, from the date your residency permit was issued.

If you haven't yet been vaccinated:

[Click here](#) to locate the nearest vaccination center to you. Appointments are not required, though students below the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

Residents must present their Emirates ID at registration, while new arrivals to the school community will need to show a passport and residency entry permit with UID, in addition to presenting an employee ID, employment or enrolment letter from a school, and displaying green or grey status on the Alhosn app.

The Unified Identification Number (UID) is a six-digit number automatically assigned to anyone who enters the UAE. This six-digit number is used to identify a person entering the UAE for any reason (employment, tourist, dependent, etc.) for immigration records.

If you already received your vaccination in your home country:

Before leaving home, complete the “[Register Arrivals and Vaccination certificates Attestation](#)” through the Federal Authority for Identity and Citizenship (ICA) website or app and upload your international vaccination certificate. You will then receive an SMS including a link to download Alhosn app.

On arrival in Abu Dhabi, you will receive a Unified Identification Number (UID) either at the airport or via the ICA app or website.

You then need to download and register on the Alhosn app, using the UID and phone number used for ICA registration or when taking a PCR test in the UAE. You will receive a one-time password (OTP) to complete the Alhosn app registration process.

Vaccinated individuals receive a “green status” on the Alhosn app. To maintain the vaccinated status on the Alhosn app, a booster dose must be taken 6 months after receiving the second dose per the medical protocol for each vaccine.

How does Alhosn work for you?

Alhosn will generate a unique personal QR code following a colour-coding system to determine your COVID-19 test status.

A LITTLE BIT OF RED TAPE



Moving to the UAE is exciting but when you arrive, you'll need to take care of some essential life admin. The good news is, your employer will help you with the vast majority. They will arrange your visa medical and take care of your paperwork for your residence visa, Emirates ID, health insurance and even housing.

Your Emirates ID is very important, remember to keep it with you at all times. It's your lifeline to access the city's services and certain buildings - you will find you are frequently asked to produce it so keep your card handy!



You will, however need to take care of a few things yourself, such as opening a bank account, setting up a mobile phone, plus internet and TV packages for your home. Here's a quick guide to help you!

BANKING

Opening a bank account in Abu Dhabi is pretty simple. Before you start, it may be worth asking at your school if they recommend a specific bank that offers preferred conditions.

To open an account, you will need:



* UAE Residence visa

* Passport

* Emirates ID

* Salary certificate from your employer

While we provide you with the names and links of Abu Dhabi's most prominent banks in the "[Useful apps & links](#)" section of this document, you can find a list of all UAE financial institutions on the website of the [UAE Central Bank](#).

SIM CARDS & MOBILE SERVICES

You may have been provided with a SIM card by your employer (in case you haven't, it may be worth asking them if there are special plans or packages available for you). This section offers handy information so you can explore all available options before committing to a plan.

There are three service providers: [Etisalat](#), [du](#) and [Virgin Mobile](#). You may find one suits your needs better than the other. We recommend researching on their websites.

Etisalat offers an all-in-one pack called [visitor line](#), which costs AED 100. It includes a local SIM for your phone and is valid for up to 60 days. It can be further extended, but most new arrivals will have their residency visas and accommodation settled by then and will probably want to move to something more comprehensive (and cheaper) for the longer term use.



Du also offers pretty much the same service, it's called the [visitor mobile line](#). This costs just AED 35 and is valid for 7 days. It can also be renewed/topped up, so you'd need to do the math on which of the two deals above is best/cheapest for your personal needs.

Regardless of which company you choose, you'll come under pressure when you visit the shops to buy a "combo" package (mobile, landline, internet and television) for a single monthly fee and for a contractual period between 1-2 years.

If that's what you're looking for, then go ahead and sign on the line. But it may save you heartache further down the line if you do your research first.

PREPAID VS POSTPAID

Operators may offer more data or discounts when you sign up for 12 months or 24 months contract. There may be penalties for breaking a contract though, so do your research before you sign up. For reference, you will need to choose between **prepaid** (bill is paid in advance) or **postpaid** (bill paid at end of the month).

If you need more minutes or extra mobile data, it's always easier to upgrade your package than downgrade it!

GOOD TO KNOW

UAE phone service providers will be happy to sell you a new phone. Some of their packages include the newest models plus minutes/texts/data. So, over the 12 or 24 months contract period, you can pay off the cost of the phone as well as paying for the services you are using.

FACETIME, VIBER, WHATSAPP, AND VOIP

All UAE internet usage is regulated by the [Telecommunications and Digital Government Regulatory Authority](#) (TRA). Many sites deemed offensive, either religiously, culturally or politically, are blocked. Facetime is not included on iPads and iPhones bought in the UAE and won't work if you try to install or use the app.

There are no restrictions on the use of WhatsApp, Viber, or Messenger for text messaging. However, the free phone calling function is blocked. The same applies to Skype. The good news is that UAE residents can legally use the following VoIP apps, approved by the government:

- BOTIM** - Available on Google Play and Apple App Stores. Anybody can use it to make VoIP calls, but it requires a monthly subscription of AED 50. Users can also include it in their internet calling plan with Etisalat or du.
- Hu Messenger** - This is a VoIP app that is officially supported by both du and Etisalat. Users who pay for unlimited data with an internet calling plan subscription can use Hu Messenger.
- C'Me** - This is a VoIP app that is officially supported by both the du and Etisalat networks. Users who pay for unlimited data with an internet calling pack subscription can use C'Me Messenger.
- Microsoft Teams** - The restrictions on this app have been lifted to allow employees, students and teachers to communicate during lock down.
- Zoom** - This popular, free app has been unblocked to allow companies to conduct meetings of up to 100 people (or more with a large meeting license).
- Google Hangouts** - This popular app has also been unblocked due to COVID-19. Users can voice and video call as well as group chats.
- Voico UAE** - This is a UAE based VoIP service that is currently available for voice and video calls. The service is freely available on the Google Play and Apple app stores. However, some users have reported that it only works when connected to WiFi.

The list above is subject to change.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

While anybody can buy a pre-paid SIM card with an official identity document, such as a passport, the below documents are needed for a resident to sign-up for a post-paid residential plan:

- * Original Emirates ID
- * Any one of the following:
 - Stamped salary certificate (minimum salary: AED 2,500)
 - Vehicle license
 - 3-month bank/online bank statement
 - Last month's utility bill with physical address
 - Tenancy or ownership contract
 - Ministry of Labour contract (minimum salary: AED 2,500)

HOME INTERNET, LANDLINE AND TV

If you're moving into company accommodation, this may be provided. However, here is an overview in case you would like to change/upgrade your existing arrangements or set up your own package.

Most new developments are pre-wired to service [du](#) internet, landline and television, whereas apartments and villas in non-freehold parts of the city are almost all serviced by [Etisalat](#). Both companies provide similar home services and offer a number of packages and bundles to suit different budgets.

While the package prices of both companies are also similar, costs vary greatly depending on the internet speed, plan and add-ons you choose. Those add-ons could include a phone landline and TV packages.

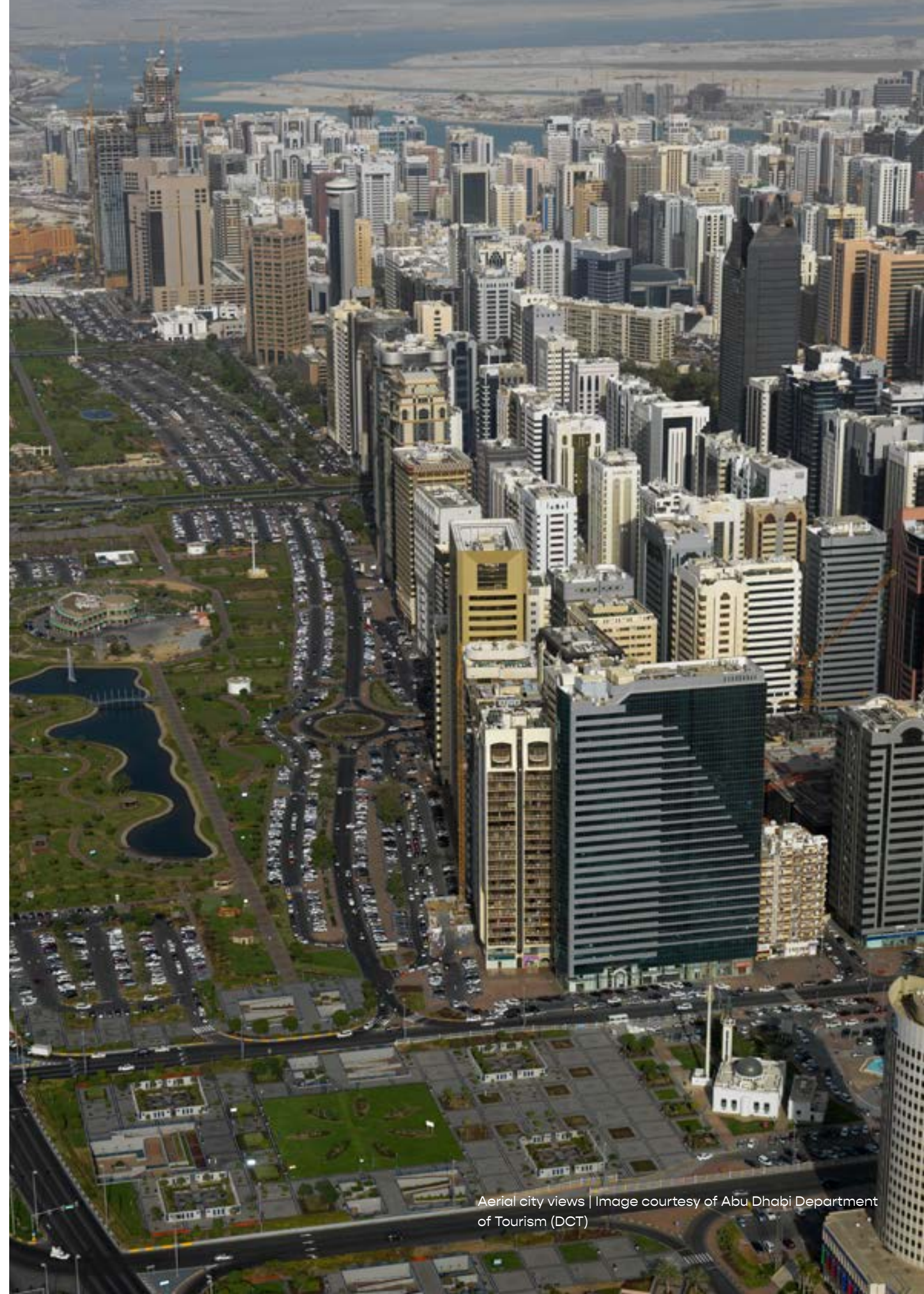
Although there are some free TV channels in Abu Dhabi, the choices are limited. Paying for a package offers more channels, in different languages. The main providers – [OSN](#), [Etisalat](#) and [du](#) – offer packages and home installation services at competitive rates.

You can make your request and complete the application process through the websites, provided you are:

- * A UAE resident
- * Aged 18+ (Etisalat) or 21 (du). du will accept an NOC from someone aged 21 or older agreeing to be responsible for your account
- * Earn a minimum salary of AED 2,500 (if opting for a post-paid account)

Once you decided on your preferred provider, selected your desired packages and add-ons, all you need to subscribe is:

- * A scan of your passport
- * A scan of your Emirates ID
- * A scan of your tenancy contract or title deed (if applicable)
- * A scan of your salary certificate (depends on the package you choose)
- * A credit card to make required payments

GETTING AROUND



DRIVING IN ABU DHABI

OBTAINING YOUR UAE DRIVER'S LICENSE

The good news is that your driver's license from your home country may be transferable, however some additional steps, including an eye test, may be necessary.

IF YOU HAVE A LICENSE FROM ANOTHER COUNTRY

If you're on a visit visa, it is possible to use your international license from home, please check with your rental car company before hiring a car. However, as soon as you get your UAE resident's visa, you can't just hit the road, you will need a UAE driver's license.

If you're a resident and you have a license from one of the countries listed below, you're in luck, as it's a relatively simple process to transfer your license:

The driving license must be valid (or within one year of expiry) and you must be a citizen of the country where the license was registered.

If the license you hold is from a country not featured on the previous list, you will be required to pass the theory and practical driving tests here in the UAE. More information on eligibility can also be found [here](#).

STEPS TO TRANSFER YOUR INTERNATIONAL LICENSE

First, you'll have to get your printed driving license translated into Arabic. You can do that at any official typing or translation center in the city.

Before paying for translation services, check if the translation center you visit is licensed and recognized by the Ministry of Interior. For more information, please [visit this website](#).

Next, visit the [Drivers and Vehicles Licensing Department](#), located in Mussafah CAD (phone: 800 3333), with the following documents:

- * A passport photo
- * Original and one copy of your passport
- * Emirates ID
- * Original and one copy of your foreign driving license
- * One copy of your valid Abu Dhabi residency visa
- * A letter of no objection from your current employer or your visa sponsor
- * An Arabic translation of your existing license

When you visit the licensing center, you will need to take an eye test in a nearby building. If that's successful you'll pay AED 100 before being sent to collect your Abu Dhabi license. The whole process (including eye test and translation fees) will cost around AED 800.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU HAVE NO LICENSE AT ALL?

If you're starting from square one, you will need to obtain a learning permit before you can get your motoring career into first gear.

First, visit the [Emirates Driving Company](#) (phone: 02 551 1911) and open a driving file. You will need:

- * A copy of your passport and residence visa page
- * A copy and original Emirates ID card
- * Two photographs
- * An eye test report
- * No objection letter from your sponsor (employer)

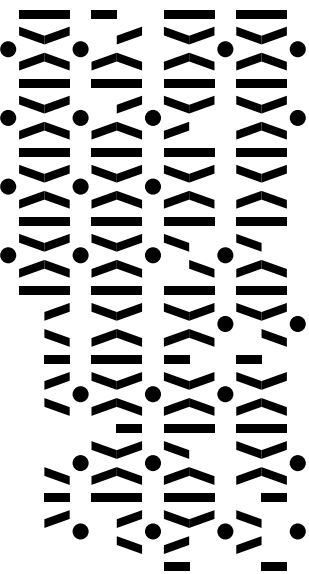
The Emirates Driving School courses are split into theory and practical classes. In order to start practical sessions, the applicants must complete eight theory classes and pass the theory test. After successfully passing the theory test, you can begin practical training sessions with an instructor.

Learner drivers generally require between 10-30 hours of lessons, depending on previous experience. Once you are ready to take the practical test, your instructor will give you a 'certificate of readiness.' This must be presented to EDC before booking the practical test.

Once you pass your practical driving test on the roads, you'll get a certificate, then you can take that to the [Drivers and Vehicles Licensing Department](#) in Mussafah as proof of your completion.

Once there, you'll be able to get your license as described in the previous section. UAE and GCC citizens can renew their license every 10 years. For foreign expats, the license renewal term is after five years and can be applied for online [here](#).

BASIC TRAFFIC RULES



MANDATORY SEAT BELTS FOR ALL

All passengers in a car must wear seat belts, including those sitting in the rear seat, failing which the driver of the vehicle will be fined AED 400 and slapped with four black points.

Children up to four years of age must be provided with a child safety seat. Violators will be fined AED 400 and slapped with four black points.

The front seat passenger should also be at least 145 cm tall and not younger than 10 years old.

RECKLESS DRIVING

Reckless driving will incur a fine of AED 2,000, 23 black points and impounding of the vehicle for 60 days.

The same punishment and fine will apply to drivers who endanger the lives of others.

Other violations cover: blocking traffic, jumping red signals, sudden swerving and driving without a number plate.

TRAFFIC SIGNALS

Motorcycle riders and motorists who ignore traffic lights will be fined AED 1,000, incur a penalty of 12 points and vehicles can be seized for a month.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

Drivers caught under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol will have their license suspended for one year, starting from the day of the verdict. The court will decide the fine and/or jail term.

DRIVER'S BEHAVIOR

Violations include:

- Throwing garbage
- Not leaving a safe distance between vehicles
- Overtaking on the hard shoulder
- Crowding around accident sites
- Using quad-bikes on road
- Jaywalking

DISTRACTIONS

Using phones while driving or any other distractions will result in an AED 400 fine and four black points.

SPEEDING

Those exceeding the speed limit by 80 kmph will be fined AED 3,000, slapped with 23 black points and have their car impounded for 60 days.

RENTING A CAR

While owning a car is the dream for most of us, the high maintenance cost and loan repayments can be a drawback. So you might wish to rent a car instead, especially if you don't want the burden of having to sell a car when you leave the UAE.

Here are the things to keep in mind when renting a car in the UAE to ensure you get the best deal.

REQUIREMENTS AND RATES

To rent a car in the UAE, you must be at least 21 years old with a valid UAE driver's license. Other required documents include a copy of your passport, resident visa and Emirates ID.

Rental rates range approximately between AED 70 to AED 120 per day or less (subject to change), depending on the car model.

You only need to pay the amount covering the period – daily, weekly or monthly – in which the car will be hired. There's no need to place a down payment. But some long-term lease deals usually require three months' advance for brand new cars.

Most car rental companies require a refundable deposit amount of at least AED 1,000. This will allow the company to automatically deduct from the customer when needed, particularly when it comes to traffic-related fines.

CAR RENTAL COMPANIES

There are many companies to choose from in Abu Dhabi for both short- and long-term rental options.

THINGS TO KEEP AN EYE ON

Renting a car means you don't have to worry about tedious paperwork, registering, insuring and servicing the vehicle – all these are taken care of by the rental company. It's a great option while you work out if you want to buy a car or not.

Carefully read the car rental contract before signing to gain a clear understanding of extra charges that might apply



- > Look out for mileage restrictions which outline the number of kilometers you're allowed to drive the car without additional charges. Some companies offer unlimited mileage, so it's worth asking around.
- > Basic comprehensive insurance should be automatically included in your rental rate. But in addition to that, there's an excess insurance coverage stipulated in the contract should the car incur major damages. This is necessary so that the car rental company can make insurance claims if needed.
- > Keep in mind that it is the renter's responsibility to pay the excess insurance in the event of any damage. For luxury vehicles, the excess amount may range from AED 1,000 to AED 3,000, normal saloon cars from AED 600, while SUVs are usually around AED 1,000. The excess insurance applies per damage and per police report and applies for damage at fault or without a third party involved.
- > Some companies offer CDW, or collision damage waiver, to select customers, particularly repeat customers who have a good track record. The CDW is optional damage insurance that minimizes the financial liability of the customer.
- > In case of an accident, you must obtain a police report. In case of black point charges, you need to visit the police station within 48 hours from the time of notification.
- > Car rental companies discourage, and in some cases contractually prevent, clients from using leased vehicles for off-road driving which can leave the car susceptible to damage. In general, driving off-road must be done with private cars and not with rented models.
- > Only the registered person is allowed to drive the leased vehicle. An additional driver can be registered by submitting necessary documents including a valid license, visa copy and by paying a registration fee.
- > Again, car rental companies differ in their policies so it's best to scout for options to compare prices, conditions and guidelines. The most important thing is to know the stipulations in the contract and ask questions.

BUYING A CAR

Probably one of the first decisions you have to make is if you would like to buy a new car, a second-hand or pre-owned car instead. Online portals like [Dubicars](#) make the buying process easier by showing you new and used cars for sale.

There are pros and cons either way. New cars are more expensive and come with a higher insurance premium, they may require less maintenance cost, may be more fuel-efficient and can be customized. Pre-owned or used cars are comparatively much cheaper but may require more maintenance.

Car dealers for new and used cars, regardless if they are represented online or physical, usually sort out all the required paperwork and processes, such as finance, insurance and registration. If you buy a used car from a private individual, you'd need to take care of these things yourself.

However this shouldn't discourage you from a private purchase. The process can mainly be completed online with a couple button clicks. However, a physical car inspection at an authorized testing center will still be required (please refer to "[Vehicle Inspection](#)" in the "[Registering a car](#)" section for more registration details).



A FEW TOP TIPS

RESEARCH

Before sealing the deal, do your research. Look into:

- * Reliability
- * Known problems
- * Overall value
- * Is it the right car for you and your family?

Take your time and don't rush into a purchase even if it screams "AMAZING DEAL, CHANCE OF A LIFETIME, DON'T MISS OUT!" as you could face issues further down the line. Be sure to check out reviews as well to get a deeper insight into the vehicle.

SHOP AROUND

You may have found the perfect car, but that shouldn't stop you from shopping around. Always look for an alternative or two just in case there is a better deal out there. GET YOUR FINANCES IN ORDER

Before you take this forward, first ask yourself, “can I afford this car?” Buying a car is not a small purchase. Different banks, dealers or online sellers offer an online finance calculator you can use to calculate how much the car will cost over a certain amount of years. Budget yourself correctly, and don’t overspend to avoid regrets further down the line.

GET A FEEL

Before making a down payment, go and check the car out. Sit inside and feel if it fits you and your needs. You don’t want an uncomfortable car, especially if you plan to use it a lot and on long journeys.

Check out other features. Are they in the right place? Do they all make sense? And most importantly, does it have what you want? If you’re shopping around for a car for your family, make sure your family fits in and won’t outgrow it in a matter of months. It is also advisable to take the car for a test drive in the city and possibly on the highway.

If you are purchasing a used car from a private individual and want to make sure there are no hidden defects or non-disclosed accidents, you may want to consider agreeing with the current vehicle owner to take the car to one of the authorized car inspection centers to have it tested at your own cost (please refer to “[Vehicle Inspection](#)” in the “[Registering a car](#)” section for more registration details).

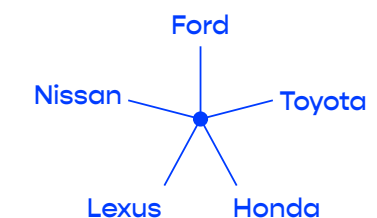
NEGOTIATE

Don’t be afraid to haggle. Just don’t offer the seller half of what they are asking. If you’re buying from a dealership, ask them about any current car promotions they have running. They may not be able to lower the price, but can offer possible freebies including warranty and even deferred payments adding value to purchasing a car. Hagglng is normal when buying a car in the UAE.



DEPRECIATION

Depreciation is something you should always consider when buying a car. As soon as you buy a car and put a few 100 km on the clock, the value of the vehicle drops. In general, a vehicle that costs less to buy will depreciate slower compared to more expensive rides. Here is a list of vehicles with slower depreciation in UAE:



Cars that do not depreciate do exist but are rather expensive even when new. These tend to be hypercars, enthusiast's cars and cars with short or capped production runs.

RUNNING COSTS

Petrol is still relatively cheap in the UAE but doesn’t mean you should go out and buy a 5.7-litre V8 SUV. Keep in mind that filling up is a weekly occurrence and can add up. Maintenance is also something to think about. While maintenance prices for most standard cars aren’t as high as in many other countries due to parts being easier to find, they can add up even if they are cheap. Oil changes, tyre rotation, wheel balance, A/C repair and tyre changing are all services that need to be addressed during car ownership. European cars tend to be more expensive to maintain, followed by American cars. Japanese, Korean and Chinese are the cheapest. In addition, you need to bear in mind insurance costs and regular vehicle registration renewal fees.



CAR INSURANCE

Every car must have car insurance in the UAE. In case of any natural damage or accidents, your car is protected financially. Basically, if there is any damage caused to your car, the bill will be paid by the insurance company. Car insurance generally lasts for a year. However, most insurers offer the 13th month free.

A FEW TOP TIPS

REPUTATION

The reputation of a company really matters. Always look for an insurer with a good reputation.

CUSTOMER SUPPORT RELIABILITY

Contact customer support and see how they deal with customers. That will give you a good idea of how customer support is going to respond to you in case of an accident.

FEEDBACK FROM FRIENDS

You can ask around and see what people think of the insurer. Those close to you will not sugarcoat the insurer as they don't gain anything from it.

CAR INSURANCE TYPES

There are two types of car insurance in the UAE: comprehensive car insurance and third-party insurance.

Comprehensive insurance ...

offers wide protection on the car. It takes care of any damage caused to the car by the owner or a third party. It also covers the car in case of theft, natural disaster, fire, etc. As it offers a wider range of coverage on the car, the comprehensive insurance premium is also higher compared to third party insurances.

Third party insurance...

does not cover the car of the insurance holder. It only covers the other party involved in the accident. So the you would have to pay for the damage to your own car which could be more expensive in the long run. The premium on this insurance is therefore much less than comprehensive car insurance.

If you feel the insurance premium is too high, you may be able to reduce it by:

- Getting a “no claim” certificate
- Pay higher deductibles or excess fee
- Only include the add-ons that are essential for your needs

REGISTERING A CAR

Your car cannot be on the road until it is registered however, the Abu Dhabi authorities have made this process pretty easy.

FIRST-TIME REGISTRATION

Registration of a new car in Abu Dhabi is usually the responsibility of the agency or dealership from which you buy the vehicle. Even if it's a second-hand car you are registering for the first time in Abu Dhabi the process is fairly similar. There are multiple outlets available to start the process:

- MOI smart application or [website](#)
- [Emirates Vehicle Gate](#)

To register a new car in your name, you will have to follow these steps:

1. You will need to get your vehicle inspected at an authorized testing center. This can be skipped if your car was produced in the last three years before the date of registration. Car registration in Abu Dhabi is only possible if you get a positive inspection result (see “Vehicle Inspection” on the next spread for more information).
2. Get vehicle insurance from an authorized insurer.
3. Pay any pending fines (if applicable).
4. Apply for your Abu Dhabi car registration through the above-mentioned registration channels.
5. Pay the registration fees.
6. Collect the plate number, expiry date sticker and vehicle ownership card.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The new car registration fee is AED 400 and requires the following documents:

- Proof of ownership (vehicle clearance certificate (VCC), export certificate, transfer certificate, possession certificate or possession transfer certificate)
- Emirates ID, passport copy, copy of residence visa
- Car insurance
- Mortgage (if applicable)

Your car registration is usually valid for 12 months. A 30-day grace period starts after these 12 months, where one can get the car repaired (if needed), inspected and insured. All insurance policies remain valid for thirteen months, hence, your grace period is also covered.

The penalty for driving a car with expired registration is AED 500 and four black points. In some cases, cars can be impounded for a week and drivers can lose their license.

REGISTRATION RENEWAL

The annual car registration renewal fee is AED 350 and can be paid online or in person. The documents required are quite similar to those needed for the initial registration:

- Emirates ID and driving license
- Renewed motor vehicle insurance
- Old registration card
- New cars are exempt from inspection testing for the first 2 years. From the third year, you will have to visit the vehicle testing center to get an assessment and get the required certification.
- Payment of fines

Once you have all the required documents, there are two ways you can submit them for car registration renewal in Abu Dhabi. You can visit the registration center of the [Abu Dhabi Police General Headquarters](#). Once the process is complete you will be given a new registration sticker. Place the new sticker on your rear number plate – directly on the old one.

Alternatively, you can renew your car registration online. Visit the [Abu Dhabi Police e-services portal](#). After logging in, select the registration tab, enter all required details, submit documents and confirm your preferred delivery method. Within five working days, the process will be completed. Similarly, the [MOI website](#) and [Emirates Vehicle Gate](#) can also be used. The process would be the same.

VEHICLE INSPECTION

The cost of the inspection is AED 170 and it takes about 30 to 45 minutes on average. If the car fails once, you need to get the problem resolved. All tests are charged individually, so it might be wise to eradicate all the issues before going for the test.

PARKING PAYMENT (MAWAQIF)

The Department of Transport launched the Mawaqif Program to establish a world-class car parking management system. Public parking areas are classified into two categories, standard and premium.

The parking fees are applicable from 8:00 am to 12:00 am from Saturday to Thursday. Parking is free on Fridays, public holidays and for people with special needs. Parking bays in the vicinity of a mosque are free for 45 minutes starting from the call for prayer (Adhan).

MAWAQIF PAYMENT METHODS

CASH PAYMENT

Buy a ticket from any Mawaqif Pay & Display machines identified by the Mawaqif logo and painted in turquoise, corresponding to the color of the curbstone. The ticket must be visibly displayed inside the car on the front dashboard.

RECHARGEABLE CARDS

RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMITS

APARTMENT AREAS

If you are in company accommodation, check if your parking is included. Residential permits allow you to park in paid parking areas that are located within the same area you live in without paying the hourly or daily rates. Residential permits can be obtained from any Mawaqif customer service center.

Areas designated for residents can be easily identified through Mawaqif signs marked with "Resident Permit Only" non-resident permit holders are not allowed to use these areas from 9:00 pm to 8:00 am, however, they can use them otherwise after paying the relevant fees.

Every expatriate resident living in an apartment can get two parking permits in their area, at a cost of AED 800 for the first permit and AED 1,200 for the second permit (fees are indicative and subject to change, please visit the [Mawaqif website](#) for up-to-date information).

VILLA AREAS

Villa resident permits help you find car parking in your villa neighborhood. Areas designated for villa residents can be easily identified through Mawaqif signs marked with "Villa Resident Permit Only" non-villa resident permit holders are not allowed to park their cars in these areas at any time.

Every resident family living in a villa is allotted two residential permits only. The annual fees are AED 800 for the first permit and AED 1,200 for the second permit (fees are indicative and subject to change, please visit the [Mawaqif website](#) for up-to-date information).

REQUIRED RESIDENT PERMIT DOCUMENTS

- Passport copy with a valid residency visa
- Copy of tenancy contract "Tawtheeq" or proof of residence ownership
- Electricity and water bill for the last 3 months
- Vehicle registration card
- Proof of first-degree relationship of the vehicle owner with the tenant of the property owner (if the applicant is not the tenant or property-owner)

MAWAQIF VIOLATIONS

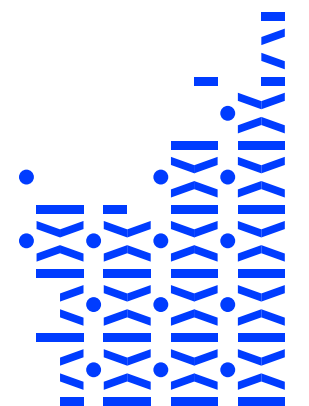
Illegally parked vehicles will be fined with charges ranging from AED 100 to AED 1,000 depending on the severity of the violation.

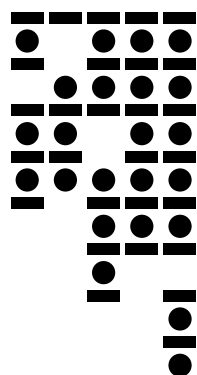
If a violation notification is ignored, your vehicle will be removed within 24-48 hours.

If vehicles park in areas where the curbstone is colored with yellow and black, block designated escape routes, spaces reserved for people with special needs, vehicles of the fire department and ambulances or for commercial use, they will be towed away immediately.

ABRA WATER HOPPING SERVICE

Take a ride along the stunning waters of Khor Al Maqta by stepping in a wooden abra (water taxi) from the Souk Qaryat Al Beri (found between the Shangri-La Abu Dhabi, Qaryat Al Beri hotel and Traders Hotel). The various routes take you along to The Ritz-Carlton Abu Dhabi, Grand Canal, Eastern Mangroves and Yas Island. Sights include the Shaikh Zayed Grand Mosque and some of the Grand Canal's fanciest hotels, lush mangroves, the original Maqta fort and the fancy yachts of Yas Island.

Use the [DARB](#) app to plan your journey and pick up a Hafilat card from the Al Wahda Central Bus Station or at any Hafilat card outlet (in shopping malls, at bus stations, ticket vending machines and customer care centers). You can load the card with credit at any of these locations or [online](#). Journeys start from AED 2.

INTERCITY BUSES

Head to Dubai, Sharjah, Al Ain, Liwa or Ruwais from the [central bus station at Al Wadha Mall on Hazza Bin Zayed Street](#). Intercity buses are more comfortable than you might think, however they can take double the time of a car journey.

CAREEM

Download the app, [sign up](#), add a payment method and away you go! This ride-hailing app connects you with private hire drivers who can take you anywhere in the city. They cost slightly more than the local taxis, but the drivers have GPS and the cars are often more modern.

E-SCOOTERS

E-scooter company Circ has scooters up for grabs on the Corniche, Yas Island and Masdar City, and they are super easy to use. All you need to do is download the [Circ app](#), set up an account, buy credit and you're ready to go. E-scooter company [Lime](#) has also just arrived in Abu Dhabi with 300 scooters available to rent across the 8km stretch of the Corniche. A great way to explore!

CYCLING

The Careem bike-share scheme is akin to London's "Boris Bikes." You can casually pick up any of the bikes or [sign up](#) to become a member. There are 300 bikes and more than 55,000 users in Abu Dhabi and prices start from AED 20 for a day. Pick one up from one of the dozens of stations between Yas Island and Emirates Palace, take a ride and drop it off when you're done. Simple.

FERRY

If you are interested in visiting Dalma Island, you can get there by ferry from Jabal al Dhanna, a small port town west of Abu Dhabi city. Ferries run three times a day (in both directions) between Saturday and Thursday and twice on Fridays. One-way tickets are 20 AED for adults and free for children younger than 12. If you are traveling in a car, you will need to pay an additional 100 AED to bring it on board. [Click here](#) for more information.

ONAK

This is another ride-hailing and concierge app similar to [Careem](#) and [Uber](#). As well as rides you can also use the service to grab shopping for you, book a cleaner, arrange wedding photography or fix your computer. There are different membership options, from pay-per-ride to monthly memberships. For more information, visit onak.ae

TAXIS

It's easy to hail a taxi while out and about in the city. But for more remote areas you should book one in advance using [The TransAD app](#) or call the hotline (600 535 353).

The starting fare from 6:00 am - 10:00 pm is AED 5 and for every kilometer up to 50 kilometers it's AED 1.82. The minimum fare is AED 12 per journey and the starting fare from the airport is AED 20 for small vehicles. Fares after 10:00 pm start at AED 5.50.

There aren't more affordable ways to get around the city. Most drivers are friendly and know their way around the city, but be sure to keep an eye out as some might say they know where they're going but are new to Abu Dhabi and will benefit from some guidance.

Always ask for a receipt from your taxi driver. Receipts have all the driver and car details on. Handy if you realize you have left your phone or jacket in the cab!

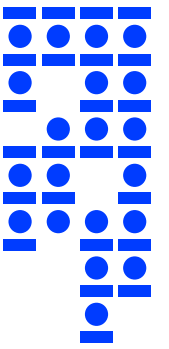
If you plan to pay cash, try to make sure you have small notes rather than AED 100 or AED 200 notes, as drivers will probably not be able to give you change from notes of that size.

UBER

Probably the biggest ride-hailing service in the world. [Uber](#) offers the same range of services you find elsewhere. Cars that come to you, use GPS, the ability to pay direct from the app and a choice of vehicles that cost different amounts depending on the size of the car. It's also good to keep an eye out for regular discount codes sent to users, especially as the base price is a little more than the local taxis.

U-DRIVE

This handy service lets you rent cars by the minute and pick up and drop off the cars from any standard Mawaqif public parking or free parking areas in Abu Dhabi. If you don't want to commit to buying a car or renting one out long term, this scheme could be just what you need. Sign up on the [U-Drive website](#), and download the app to locate, reserve and open a car parked near you.

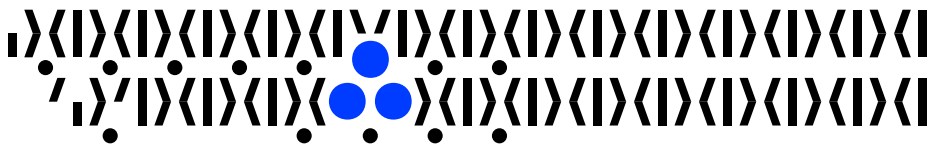


FINDING NEW ACCOMMODATION

Even though company accommodation is provided, you may wish to opt-out and move into a place of your choice. You may find something closer to your school or in another area that suits your lifestyle. In this case, your employer substitutes your rent up to the amount of your housing allowance, which is stated in your employment contract. Please speak to your employer about this for more details.



RESIDENTIAL AREAS

Abu Dhabi is ranked high among the best cities to live in the region for its quality of life and safety. The same international real estate considerations, such as location, cost (of rent, utilities, maintenance, etc.), condition, property management and amenities, apply when looking for a rental in Abu Dhabi.

Abu Dhabi’s city center is a vibrant collection of shops, shisha bars, malls, five-star hotels and restaurants. The neighborhoods that make up this capital city heartland are home to young singles and families.

It’s easy to forget that Abu Dhabi city is in actual fact on an island. Hence residential neighborhoods in Abu Dhabi are categorized as either “[Abu Dhabi island](#)” or “[Abu Dhabi mainland](#)”.

Expats who crave the frantic energy of city life will find that downtown is just the ticket; every imaginable amenity is within reach and there are countless opportunities to socialize, entertain and dine out. There are also good school and healthcare options in this part of the city. However, residents will have to sacrifice space and learn to deal with traffic.

There are plenty of “best places to live” for expats based on what you are looking for. Each area or neighborhood of Abu Dhabi has its own appeal and there are plenty of options to choose from!

Abu Dhabi’s mainland areas, such as Al Raha Beach, Khalifa City and Yas Island are becoming increasingly popular. Most of the buildings are new and there is a vast range of types and rents available. Schools and other local facilities (including shopping malls) are developing rapidly. Many of these areas are originally traditional Emirati areas and there is a much greater degree of integration as a result. These areas do not have the charm of Abu Dhabi Island but do tend to have modern facilities and good transport links with schools located within the communities they serve.

The main island still has much of its original charm. Buildings such as the Emirates Palace, Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque and the more traditional low-rise buildings, wide avenues surrounded by greenery and numerous cultural icons attest to Abu Dhabi’s authenticity.

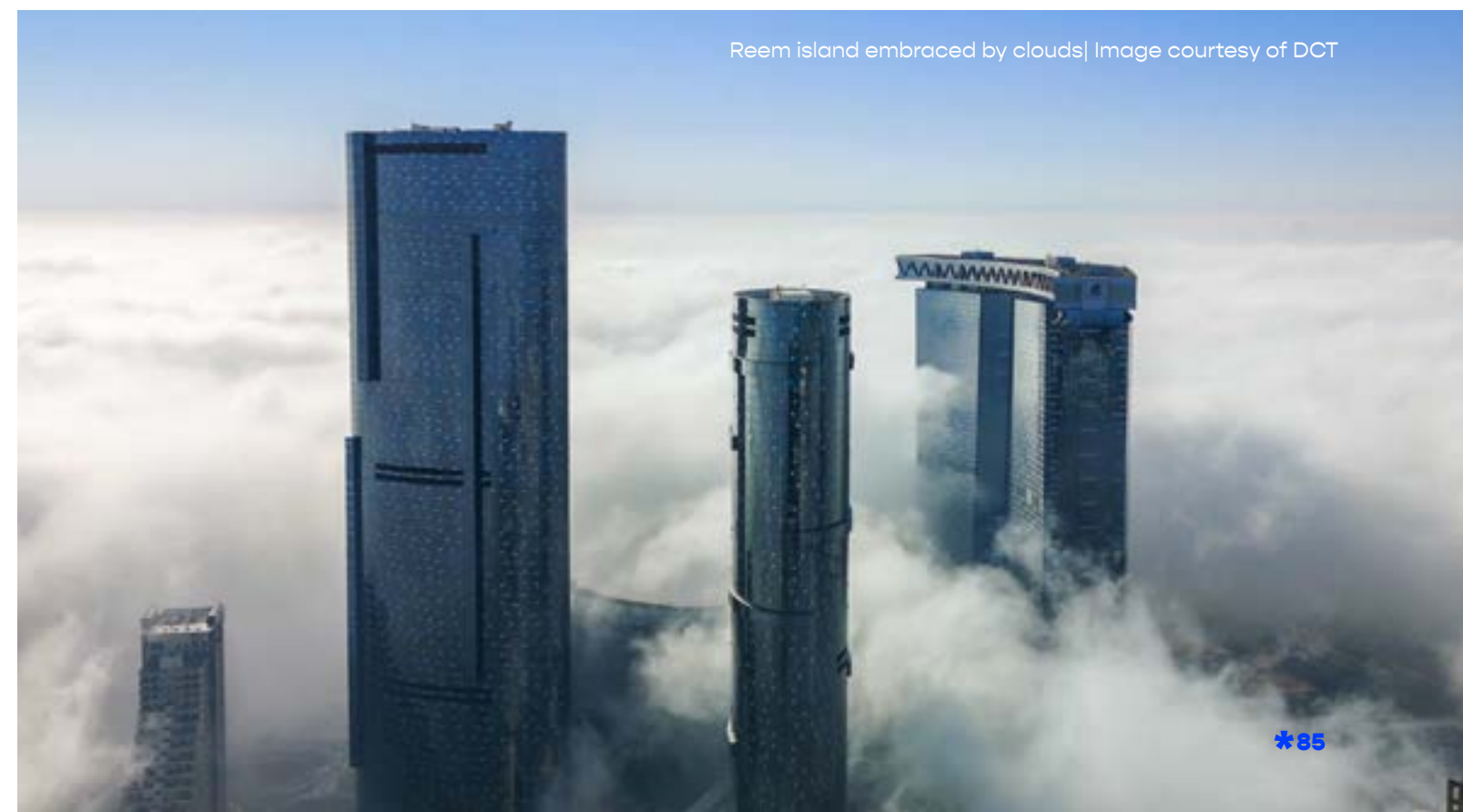

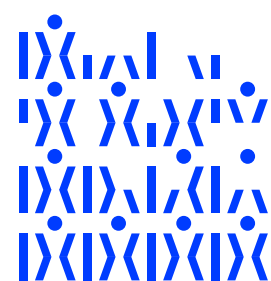

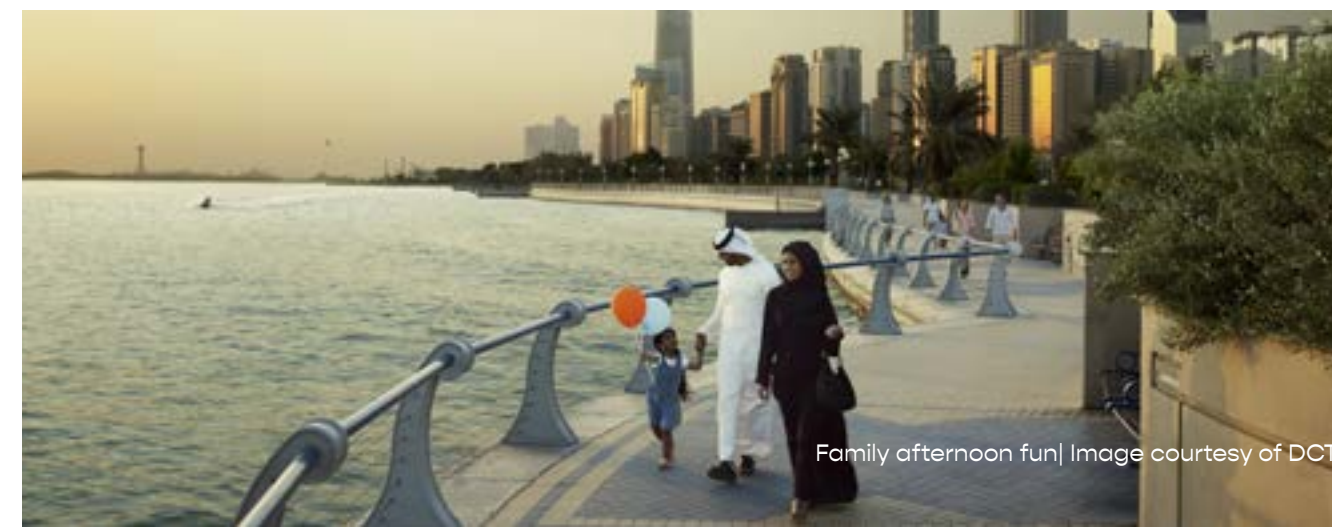

RENT RATES

You will find the rents vary and depend on the location and size of the property. It's pretty common to pay a year's rent in one payment or multiple payments can be negotiated with the broker or landlord. In addition, some brokers may require a commission fee, up to 5% of the total amount of rent.

To secure a lease contract, you need to provide:

- * Passport copy
- * Emirates ID card
- * Valid residence visa
- * Post-dated cheques to cover payments for rental period

REGISTERING LEASE AGREEMENTS

Lease agreements between landlords and tenants must be registered in the Tawtheeq system. Once the lease contract has been registered, a housing fee (3% of the annual rent value) will be charged in equal installments across 12 months. This amount will be added to the tenant's monthly water and electricity bill.

Once the lease agreement is registered in Tawtheeq, it is compulsory to connect the utility services such as: water, electricity and gas (please refer to the next section) and telecommunications services (see the previous section for more information).

CONNECTING UTILITIES

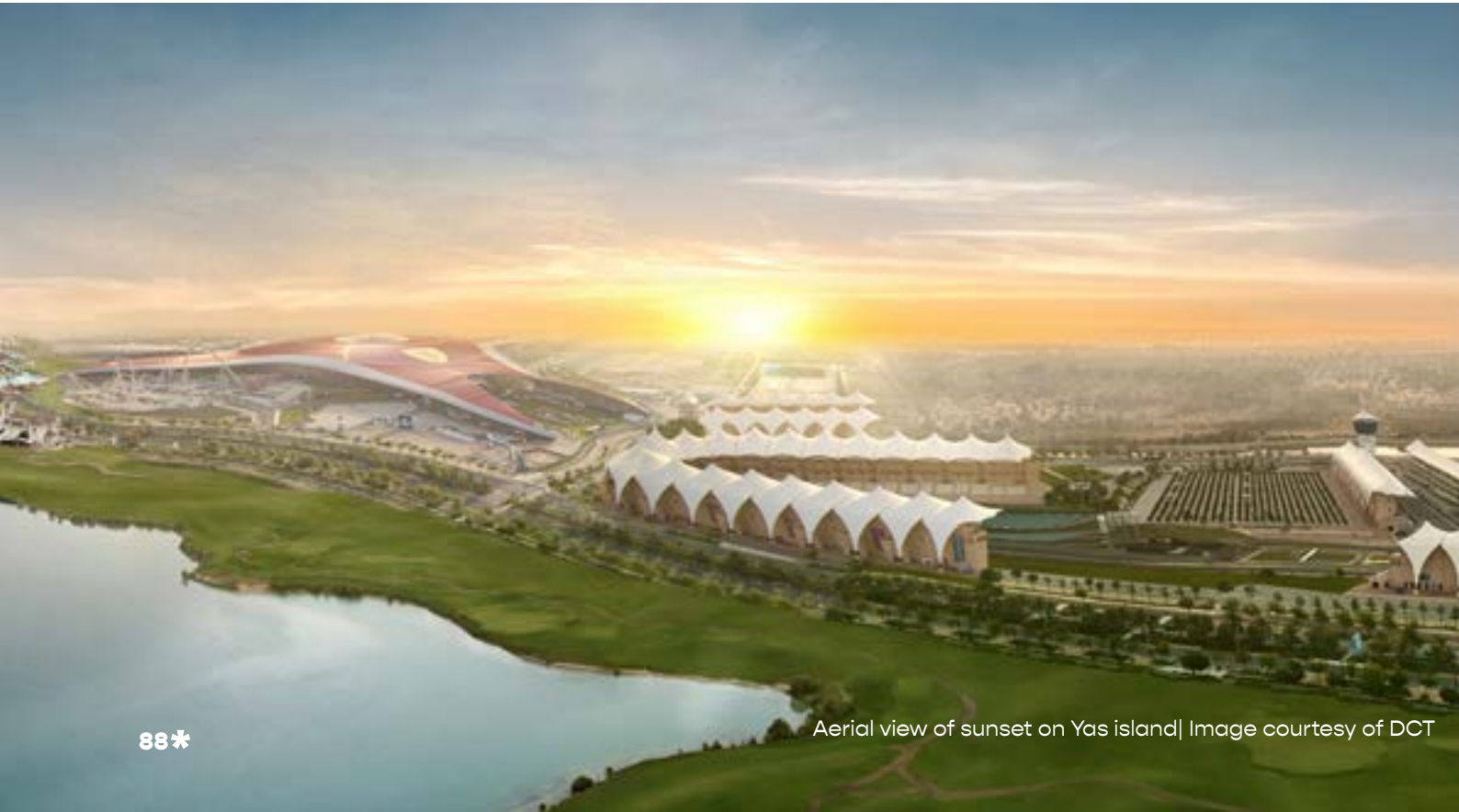
The Abu Dhabi Distribution Company is responsible for providing public utility services in Abu Dhabi city and its surroundings. To connect water and electricity services, you must apply through the website.

You need to provide:

- * Passport copy
- * Tenancy contract
- * Emirates ID card
- * Account closing letter (from the previous tenant for the property you are moving into)

You may also need to register with one of the local cooling (A/C) and/or residential gas providers. Please ask your landlord if any extra services are needed for your chosen property and which company is responsible. These could include, but are not limited to [Tasleem](#), [Tabreed](#), [Royal Gas](#), etc.

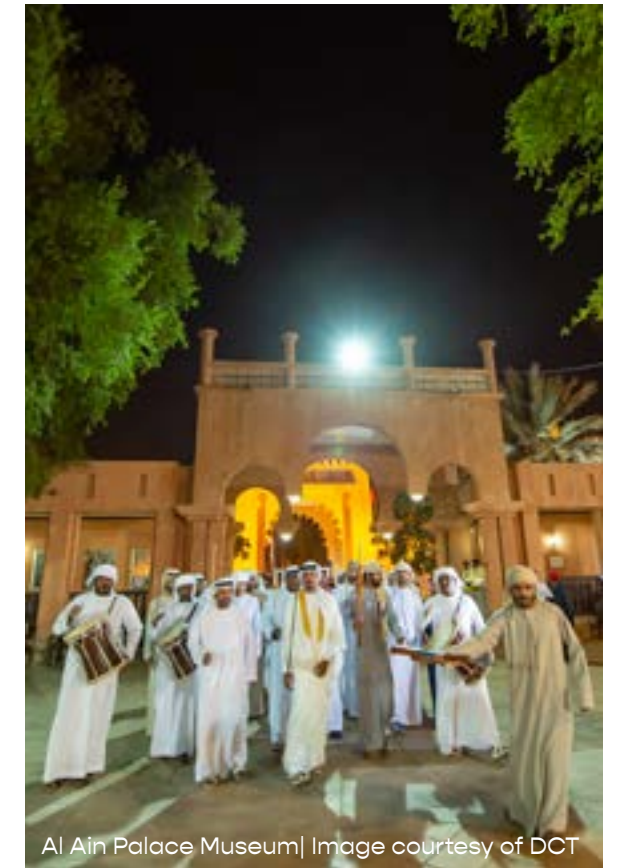
HISTORICAL & CULTURAL ATTRACTIONS

AL AIN PALACE MUSEUM

Qasr Al Ain or Al Ain Palace is one of the best-reinstated forts in Abu Dhabi and an important historical site in the UAE. It was home to the Founding Father of the UAE and the country's first president, the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, who lived here with his family until 1966, the family later moved to Abu Dhabi.

Inside the museum, the palace and private residence provide insights into the lives and culture of the ruling family and the community until the country's transformation after the discovery of petroleum. The Bedouin-style architecture (Bedouins are the nomadic Arab people from the region) dates back to 1937. The structure was converted into a museum in 1998 as a key cultural and tourist attraction. The museum opened its doors to visitors in 2001 and continues to celebrate the UAE's history, preserving its links to the past, present and future.

AL AIN MUSEUM

History buffs will fall in love with this charming museum that tells the story of the UAE's [ancient history](#). This is the oldest museum in the UAE, established in 1969 under the leadership of Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, founder of the UAE and affectionately known as Father of the Nation. Built to chart the history of [Al Ain](#) from the Stone Age through to the foundation of the UAE in 1971, the museum houses artifacts recovered from the many archaeological sites scattered across the region, including flint tools and arrowheads dating back to the sixth millennium BCE.

Divided into three main sections – Archaeology, Ethnography and Gifts – Al Ain Museum offers insights into the local traditions and culture that have defined the region.

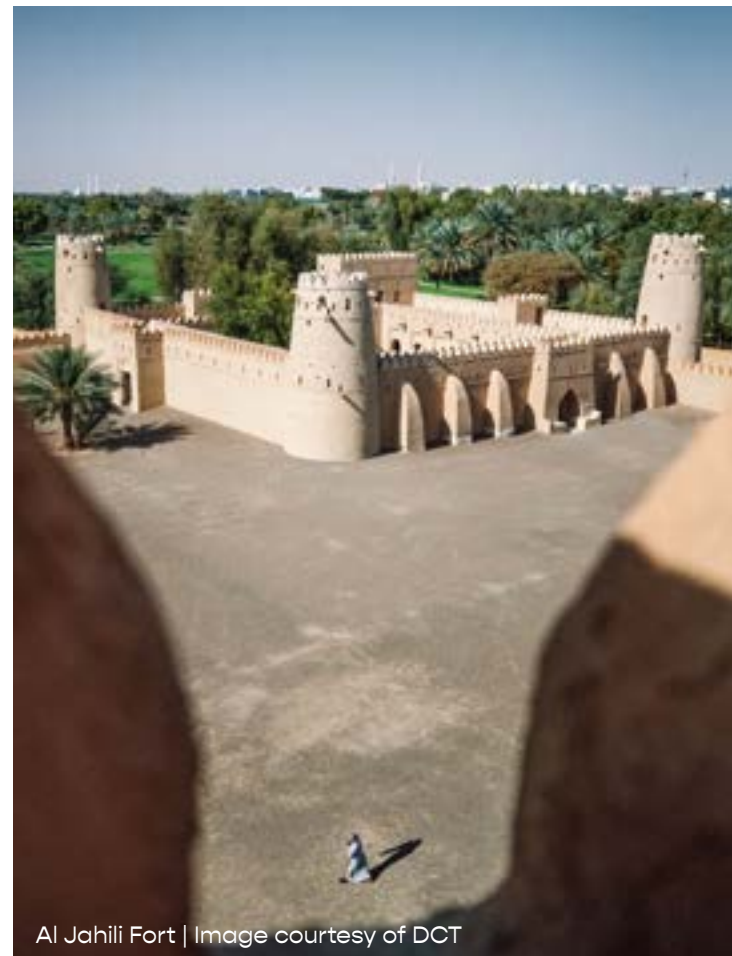

AL JAHILI FORT

Al Jahili is one of the largest forts in the UAE, built in the 1890s on the orders of Sheikh Zayed bin Khalifa Al Nahyan, also known as Zayed the First, as the home to members of the ruling Al Nahyan family. Since opening in 2008, Al Jahili Fort – set in Abu Dhabi's lush garden city of [Al Ain](#), about an hour and a half away from the capital – has been a focal point of activities associated with the philosophy, culture and heritage of Abu Dhabi.

It houses a permanent exhibition devoted to Sir Wilfred Thesiger, the intrepid explorer, travel writer and photographer who, with his Emirati and Omani companions, crossed the world's largest sand mass, the Empty Quarter (Rub' al Khali), twice in the 1940s. Al Jahili Fort is also home to a temporary exhibition gallery. Surrounded by a lush park, this enchanting fort won the prestigious Terra Award for Internal Design and Layout in 2016.

Showcasing carefully restored traditional local architecture, the center aims to provide a family-friendly venue where arts and culture can be studied, practiced and developed by the entire UAE community and visiting travelers.

BAIT AL OUD

If you love music, you'll enjoy this place which plays a key role in preserving and sharing Arabic musical instruments. It is dedicated to teaching the oud, a short-neck, lute-type, pear-shaped stringed instrument. The oud is thought to date back to the Akkadian Empire in ancient Mesopotamia, which is now modern-day Iraq.

Bait Al Oud is a center of both teaching and research. It offers music lessons and courses, continuing the tradition of crafting ouds by hand and outreach programs to spread awareness and appreciation of the oud and other Arabic musical instruments.

You'll find an impressive collection of off-road vehicles and classic American cars, the Sheikh's Mercedes rainbow collection and the world's largest truck. Some of the vehicles have even featured on the BBC television program, Top Gear.

Completed in just over a decade, the mosque was built to embody Islam's central message of peace and tolerance and welcome people of all beliefs.

SHEIKH ZAYED MAJLIS AT AL AIN OASIS HOSPITAL

Learn about the history of [Al Ain](#) and the start of modern healthcare in the UAE. The Oasis Hospital played a vital role in the history of Abu Dhabi, particularly in Al Ain. Founded by doctors Pat and Marian Kennedy, who were invited to Al Ain in 1960 by Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan and his brother Sheikh Shakhbut. During that time, the mortality rate in the region was quite high and the population was in decline. The Kennedy's team provided the first modern medical care program for the region, focusing on improving obstetric and pediatric care.

A rare collection of photos on display tells a vivid story of how Al Ain has progressed through the ages. Learn about the challenges people faced and the vast difference between what the region looks like now versus 50 years ago.

The palace also houses the Qasr Al Watan Library and House of Knowledge, where history, culture buffs and scholars, can explore a collection of books, manuscripts and other resources about the UAE to learn about the nation's progressive journey.

Located directly opposite Abu Dhabi's world-famous [Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque](#), Wahat Al Karama is a timeless tribute that honors the Emirati martyrs who sacrificed their lives in service of the country. Wahat Al Karama is home to a permanent memorial commemorating the UAE's heroes, including soldiers, police, diplomats and civilians, since 1971.

An imposing public art structure made up of 31 massive leaning tablets clad in aluminum, the symbolism behind the Memorial is clear. Each tablet leans against the other, portraying the unity, solidarity and mutual support that bind the leadership of the UAE with its citizens, residents and the servicemen and women who protect them.

Capital Gate, developed by [Abu Dhabi Convention and Exhibition Bureau](#), has been certified as the World's Furthest Leaning Manmade Tower by the Guinness World Records. Leaning 18 degrees westwards (that's more than four times that of Pisa's famous tower) the modern, 160-meter, 35-storey tower is definitely worth a photograph.

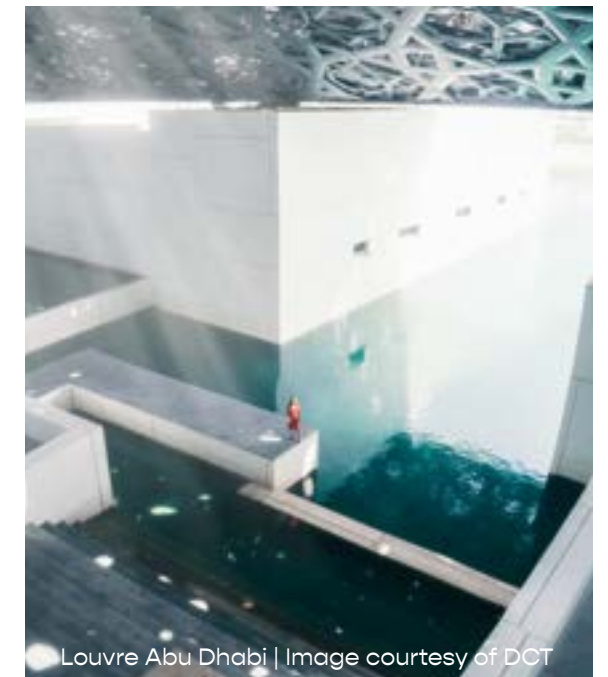

Its curved arches evoke undulating sand dunes and it features a dynamic lighting design, with subtle colors that flow across its spine. Its road decks are suspended from symmetrical steel arches, creating a wave-form with a fluid silhouette.

THE FOUNDER'S MEMORIAL

Spread over 3.3 hectares of beautifully landscaped public space boasting indigenous flora, the memorial features a Sanctuary Garden including seating areas and a traditional falaj (ancient irrigation system), a Heritage Garden rich with medicinal desert plants, and an elevated walkway offering captivating views of the Arabian Gulf, the city's dazzling skyline, and the centrepiece of The Founder's Memorial, The Constellation.

This incredible and monumental public artwork features a three-dimensional portrait of Sheikh Zayed. Housed in a 30-metre-high pavilion, The Constellation contains 1,327 geometric shapes suspended on 1,110 cables to create a series of evolving personal encounters with Sheikh Zayed's image. By night, the suspended shapes shine like stars, a reminder of Sheikh Zayed's role as a guiding light for the UAE and its people. This celestial display evokes the timelessness of Sheikh Zayed's vision, which continues to guide the UAE along a path to progress and prosperity.

ECO-CENTRE

Situated at the lush [Al Ain Oasis](#), the Eco-Centre is a wonderful place to learn more about the emirate's history. The Eco-Centre takes this experience to the next level, offering an immersive and curated experience, with interactive installations telling you all about the oases in the area, and educational games explaining their creation.

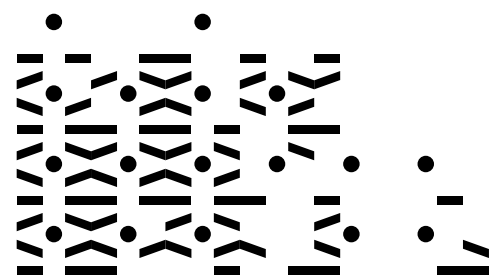

JEBEL HAFEET

For incredible sunrise and sunset photos, as well as majestic views of Al Ain, head to the top of Jebel Hafit mountain. Rising to a height of 1,249 meters, this skyline-dominating peak is Abu Dhabi's highest, and the UAE's second tallest. The habitat boasts an incredibly rich biodiversity: Some 238 species of invertebrates, which were earlier not known, have been recorded in Abu Dhabi in the last few years. A total of 320 insect species listed under 93 scientific families have so far been recorded in Jebel Hafeet. These comprise of 18 insect orders and a few other invertebrates including scorpions, camel spiders, spiders, pill bugs and centipedes that constitute the major invertebrate fauna. The mountain is also home to the rare Persian horned viper.

Reach the summit of this rocky mountain by car, motorbike or, if you have the stamina, bicycle. Once described as being "among the world's greatest driving roads" once you've reached the top and soaked up the breathtaking views, you can head over to the nearby Mercure Grand Jebel Hafeet Al Ain Hotel for a meal.

OASIS GARDEN

The Oasis Garden is in the Al Ain Oasis, a UNESCO World Heritage site comprising three separate sub-gardens that represent the oasis ecosystem.

PRE-OASIS GARDEN

This tier, represents an oasis at the time of its creation, with crops from arid areas and small palm trees providing shade while they grow. Discover sacred plants and desert flora with therapeutic uses, such as henna, indigo and aloe, all cultivated in small agricultural plots.

ORCHARD GARDEN

This second tier comprises trees growing figs, pomegranates, lemons, bananas and olives. From the Mediterranean to Africa and China, civilizations have developed by cultivating these trees.

SYMBOLIC GARDEN

The third plantation tier, comprises tall plant foliage which combats the sun's heat by creating shade, allowing all the other plants to grow in the desert. In hotter oases, the palm tree plays a major role in providing shade.

TEL MOREEB

Situated in Abu Dhabi's majestic [Al Dhafra](#) region, Tel Moreeb is considered by many to be the world's tallest dune, at over 300 meters high, with its 50-degree incline making it a prime destination for motorsports enthusiasts.

Every February, the region's most powerful four-wheel drives, quad bikes and dirt bikes compete in the Moreeb Hill Climb event, part of the Liwa International Festival. It's well worth the trip to Al Dhafra to check this out, especially if you're looking for an authentic Abu Dhabi experience. The large flat area at the dune's base is dedicated to competitors and spectators.

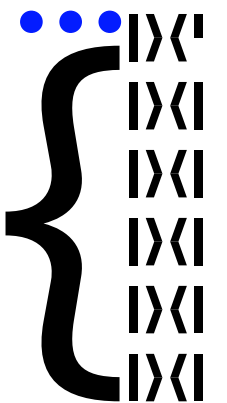

Got a few hours to explore? Abu Dhabi's mangrove forests are worth meandering on foot, boat or kayak. The indigenous mangroves serve key ecological functions – acting as windbreakers, purifying surrounding water, protecting against tidal surges and removing carbon monoxide from the atmosphere.

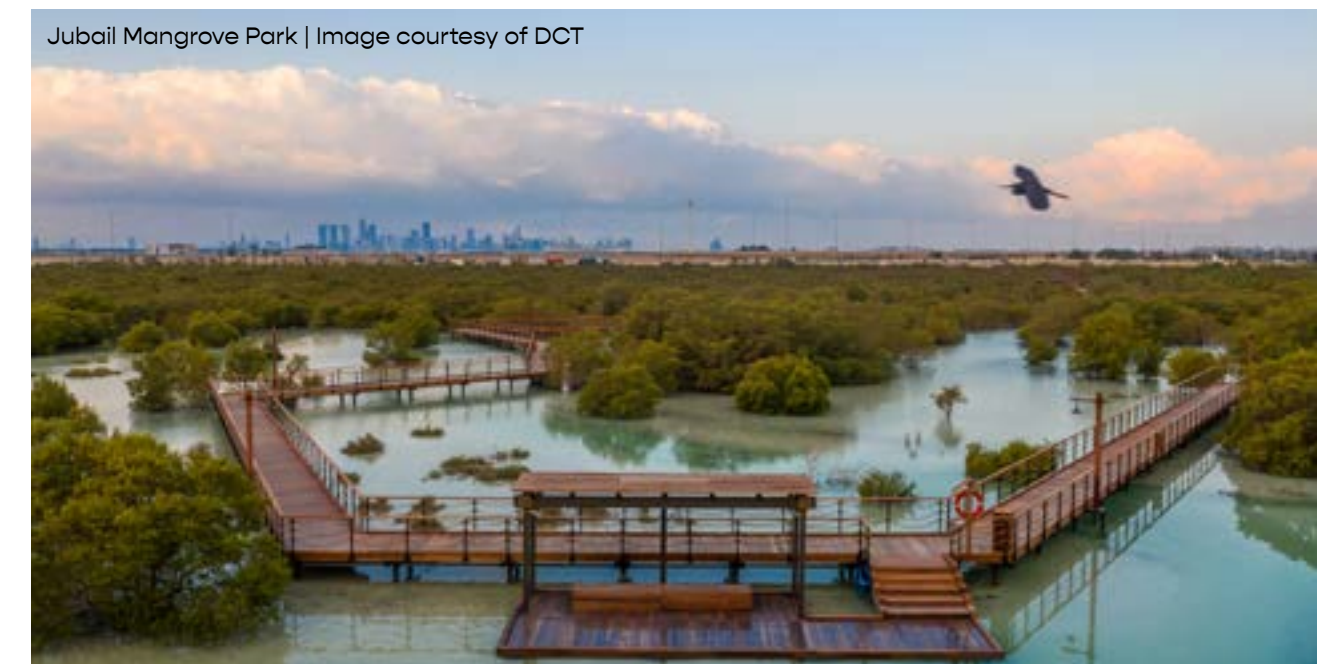
Abu Dhabi's mangrove forests are habitats for fascinating land and marine creatures – spot crabs, turtles, herons, flamingos, foxes, gazelle, dolphins and fish – a treasure trove for nature-lovers!



[The Mangrove National Park](#), a biodiversity hotspot making up about 75% of the total mangrove forest area in the UAE, is at the city's edge. Head to luxury hotel [Anantara Eastern Mangroves Abu Dhabi](#) for kayaking, tours and boat cruises, so you can fully appreciate the flora and fauna found in the park's salt marshes, mudflats and algal communities.

Birdwatchers, nature-lovers and photographers will swoon at the [Jubail Mangrove Park](#), the first self-contained educational, nature and leisure destination of its kind in the Emirate. Pack binoculars to spot some of 80-odd avian species, including the 'vulnerable to extinction' greater spotted eagle, from resting nodes, viewpoints, floating platforms, boardwalks or kayaks

Top tip: High tide is the best time to go.

IF YOU WANT A DAY OUT...

Head to [Saadiyat Island](#) for sea-side beauty or Al Wathba Fossil Dunes and wetlands for landscapes that look out of this world.

Geology enthusiasts and movie fans will love the eerie formations of the Al Wathba Fossil Dunes, where scenes from [Star Wars: The Force Awakens](#), were filmed.



These wind-whipped ancient structures seem like something from another planet. The area's Al Wathba Wetland Reserve, on the IUCN Green List of Protected and Conserved Areas, was once a coastal salt flat (sabkha) and is now a series of natural and man-made lakes. Walking trails and bird-hides let you discover the reserve's large population of Greater Flamingos, over 250 bird species, 37 plant species and interesting aquatic life. Top tip: There aren't any cafes on site, so bring snacks and refreshments.

STAYCATION TIME...

If you fancy a road trip, there are plenty of hotels to choose from. For a trip of a lifetime, head to [Sir Bani Yas Island](#), the largest island off the coast of Abu Dhabi. Famous for wildlife, it scooped the World's Leading Sustainable Tourism Destination award in 2014 and 2018. The late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan turned his private island into a nature reserve in 1977. Thanks to ongoing conservation, the [Arabian Wildlife Park](#) is full of lush plants, birds and free-roaming animals – such as the Arabian Oryx, Somali ostrich, gazelle and giraffes. Experience nature through 4x4 safaris, kayaking, mountain biking, hiking and snorkeling. After all that action, enjoy luxurious accommodation at one of three five-star Anantara retreats on the island.

[Saadiyat Island](#), the world-class leisure, residential, business and cultural hub is just a seven-minute drive from downtown Abu Dhabi. The eco island's beaches are part of protected habitat, and its waters and green spaces offer plenty of outdoor activities. There's something for everyone at the pristine [Saadiyat Beach](#) and nearby [Saadiyat Beach Club](#). The dunes here are protected, as are the critically endangered Hawksbill turtles use them as their nesting ground.

Thanks to the Hawksbill Turtle Conservation Program, some 650 eggs have hatched successfully on Saadiyat since 2010.



Keep an eye out for dolphins frolicking in the bay.

Golfers will adore the stunning sea views from the [Saadiyat Beach Golf Club](#). This Gary-Player-designed masterpiece respectfully harnesses the natural splendor of Saadiyat Island's magnificent beaches for a memorable playing experience.

DISCOVER THE DESERT...

If the magical desert calls to your nature-loving soul, head to the Rub’ al Khali, also known as the [Empty Quarter](#). The epic landscapes here have formed the backdrop to many a film, including Star Wars: The Force Awakens. The desert’s harsh, hypnotic terrain is home to hardy creatures and plants that have long fascinated scientists and explorers. The Ghaf tree, for instance, grows roots as long as 30 meters to reach waters beneath the sand, while its branches are where Desert Eagle Owls roost and breed. Desert animals include the Sand Cat, Rupell’s Fox, Sand Gazelle and Arabian Oryx.

The best way to experience the desert is from a comfortable base. Check out the magnificent [Qasr Al Sarab Desert Resort by Anantara](#) which offers [falconry](#) and [Saluki](#) shows. Falconry is a traditional Emirati sport passed down the generations for 4,000 years and was once a form of hunting in a resource-scarce land. Guided by their Bedouin (desert nomad) handlers, falcons hunted together with Salukis – one of the oldest known breeds of domesticated dog, which has been a hunting and guard dog for the desert people of the Arabian Peninsula for 5,000 years.

ENJOY AN ECO-CONSCIOUS AFRICAN SAFARI (AND A DINNER WITH LIONS)....

Another must-see destination is the [Al Ain Zoo](#), set in Abu Dhabi’s lush garden city of Al Ain, about one and a half hours away from the capital. Magnificently positioned against the imposing backdrop of Jebel Hafit, Abu Dhabi’s tallest peak, the Al Ain Safari is situated in an incredible 217-hectare park carefully crafted out of the desert environment. It’s home to African animals – including lions, white rhinos, zebra and wildebeest – and around 2,500 plants. Safari options include Emirati tour guides who have extensive knowledge of the local fauna and flora. Enjoy “Dinner with the Lions” for a sumptuous meal on the edge of the park’s lion territory. If you’d like to stay nearby, consider Jebel Hafit Desert Park. It offers camping for all budgets, from DIY to glamping under the stars.

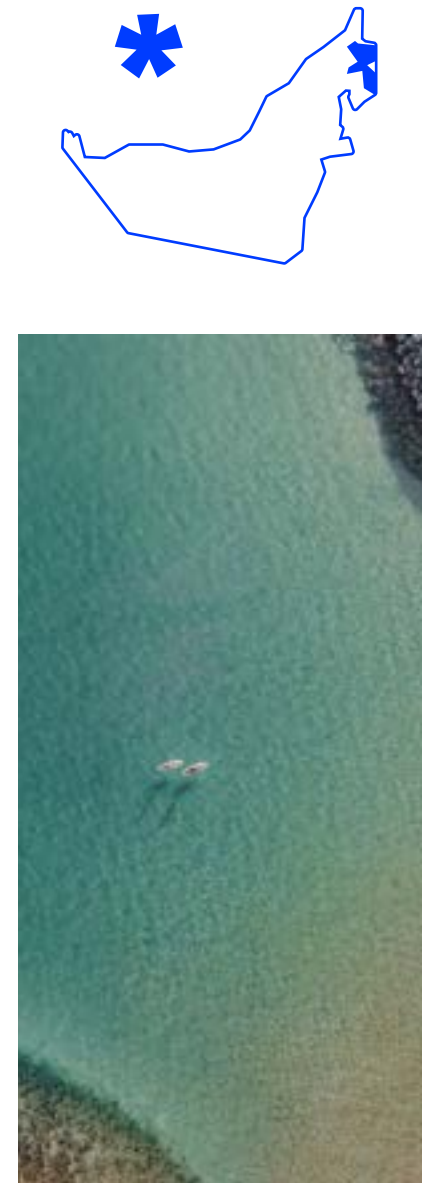


FUJAIRAH
